1. SAFETY WARNINGS

Safe operating practices for hand-held mainsoperated electrical garden vacuums, and garden blower/vacuums with or without shredding means and garden blowers

Training

- Read the instructions carefully. Be familiar with the controls and the correct use of the machine.
- Never allow children or people unfamiliar with these instructions to use the machine.
- Local regulations can restrict the age of the operator.
- Keep in mind, that the operator or user is responsible for accidents or hazards occurring to other people or their property.

Preparation

- Obtain ear protection and safety glasses. Wear them at all times while operating the machine.
- While operating the machine always wear substantial footwear and long trousers.
- Do not operate the machine when barefoot or wearing open sandals.
- Avoid wearing clothing that is loose fitting or that has hanging cords or ties.
- Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery that can be drawn into the air inlet.
- Keep long hair away from the air inlets.
- Operate the machine in a recommended position and only on a firm, level surface.
- Do not operate the machine on a paved or gravel surface where ejected material could cause injury.
- Before using, always visually inspect to see, that the bolts and other fasteners are secure, the housing is

undamaged and that guards and screens are in place. Replace worn or damaged components in sets to preserve balance. Replace damaged or unreadable labels.

- Before use, check the battery for signs of damage or aging. If the battery becomes damaged during use, stop to use the battery and remove it carefully.
- Do not use the machine if the battery is damaged or worn.
- Never operate the machine while people, especially children, or pets are nearby.

Operation

- Before starting the machine, make certain that the feeding chamber is empty.
- Keep your face and body away from the feed intake opening.
- Keep proper balance and footing at all times. Do not overreach. Never stand at a higher level than the base of the machine when feeding material into it.
- Always stand clear of the discharge zone when operating this machine.
- If the cutting mechanism strikes any foreign objects or if the machine should start making any unusual noise or vibration, immediately shut off the power source and allow the machine to stop. Remove the battery from the machine and take the following steps before restarting and operating the machine:
- Inspect for damage.
- Replace or repair any damaged parts.
- Check for and tighten any loose parts.
- Never operate the machine with defective guards or shields, or without safety devices.
- Keep the power source clean of debris and other accumulations to prevent damage to the power source or possible fire.

- Do not transport this machine while the power source is running.
- Stop the machine, and remove the battery. Make sure that all moving parts have come to a complete stop whenever you leave the machine.
- Before clearing blockages or unclogging chute.
- Before checking, cleaning or working on the machine.
- Do not tilt the machine while the power source is running.

Maintenance and storage

- When the machine is stopped for servicing, inspection, or storage, or to change an accessory, shut off the power source, remove the battery and make sure that the machine has come to a complete stop. Allow the machine to cool before making any inspections, adjustments, etc. Maintain the machine with care and keep it clean.
- Store the machine in a dry place out of the reach of children.
- Always allow the machine to cool before storing.
- Replace worn or damaged parts for safety. Use only genuine replacement parts and accessories.
- Never attempt to override the interlocked feature of the guard.

Additional instructions

- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

- Do not use the appliance in a way where danger and accidents may occur. For example do not use the tool on a ladder, in location where there is a risk of fire or in the presence of dangerous gases, etc.
- Do not overreach and keep your balance at all times.
- Do not allow hands or any other part of the body or clothing inside the feeding chamber, discharge chute, or near any moving part.

MARNING: Read all safety warnings and all instructions. Failure to follow the warnings and instructions may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The appliance is only to be used with the power supply unit provided with the appliance.

- Always be sure of your footing on slopes.
- Walk, never run.
- Always use full protective equipment: hearing protection, protective glasses, gloves, non-skid footwear, helmet, protective clothing and a mask for protection.
- Always stop the tool and remove the battery when a problem is observed. Inspect the tool, perform maintenance and/or bring it to a qualified service agent for inspection and reparation.
- Always inspect the tool before and after use. If the tool presents dysfunction or damages, do not use it and bring it to a qualified service agent for inspection and reparation.
- Check the condition of the battery before use. Do not use a damaged battery. In case of damaged battery, contact your dealer for a recommend battery for replacement.

- In case of accident or breakdown, stop using the tool immediately. Bring it to a qualified service agent for inspection and reparation.
- This tool is intended to be used outdoor for private purposes. Never use it inside a building.
- Do not expose the tool to rain and humidity.
- Do not use the tool when there is bad weather.

Safety Warnings for battery pack

- Do not dismantle, open or shred cells of the battery pack.
- Do not short-circuit a battery pack. Do not store battery packs in a box or drawer where they may short-circuit each other or be short-circuited by conductive materials. When the battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- Do not expose the battery pack to heat or fire. Avoid storage in direct sunlight.
- Do not subject the battery pack to mechanical shock.
- In the event of battery leaking, do not allow the liquid to come into contact with the skin or eyes. If contact has been made, wash the affected area with copious amounts of water and seek medical advice.
- Seek medical advice immediately if a cell or battery pack has been swallowed.
- Keep the battery pack clean and dry.
- Wipe the battery pack terminals with a clean dry cloth if it becomes dirty.
- The battery pack needs to be charged before use.
- Always refer to this instruction and use the correct charging procedure.
- Do not maintain the battery pack on charge when not

in use.

- After extended periods of storage, it may be necessary to charge and discharge the battery pack several times to obtain maximum performance.
- The battery pack gives its best performance when it is operated at normal room temperature (20°C ± 5°C).
- When disposing of the battery packs, keep the battery packs of different electro chemistry systems separate from each other.
- Recharge only with the provide charger. Do not use any charger other than that speciffically provided for use with the equipment. A non-recommended charger can create a risk of accident and fire. In case the provided charger cannot be used, contact your dealer to receive information about the recommended charger.
- Do not use any battery pack which is not designed for use with the equipment.
- Keep the battery pack out of the reach of children.
- Remove the battery from the equipment when not in use.
- Before charging, read the instructions.
- Do not charge a leaking battery.
- Do not use charger for others purposes. It is suitable only for this tool.
- Before charging, ensure your charger is matching with the local AC supply.
- The charger must be protected from moisture.
- Ensure that the connection between the battery charger and battery is correctly positioned and is not obstructed by foreign objects.
- When charging batteries, ensure that the battery charger is in a well-ventilated area and away from inflammable materials. Batteries can get hot during charging. Do not overcharge any batteries. Ensure that batteries and chargers are not left unsupervised

- during charging.
- Do not recharge non-rechargeable batteries, as they can overheat and break.
- Longer life and better performance can be obtained if the battery pack is charged when the air temperature is between 18°C and 24°C. Do not charge the battery pack in air temperatures below 4.5°C, or above 40.5°C. This is important as it can prevent serious damage to the battery pack.

Residuals risks

- The use of this product in case of rain or humid environments is prohibited.


3. THE PRODUCT
















DESCRIPTION

- Trigger
 Turbo button
- 3. Lock button
- 4. Housing
- 5. Tube latch
- 6. Blower tube
- 7. Battery pack (not provided)

KNOW YOUR BLOWER

See Figure 1.

• The safe use of this product requires an understanding of the information on the blower and in this operator's manual as well as a knowledge of the project you are doing. Before use of this product, familiarize yourself with all operating features and safety rules.

BLOWER TUBE

The blower tube can be installed on the blower without using any tools.

4. ASSEMBLY

MARNING:To prevent accidental starting that could cause serious personal injury, always remove the battery pack from the blower when assembling parts.

ASSEMBLING THE BLOWER TUBE

See Figure 2.

• Slide blower tube over the blower housing outlet until the tube latch locks into place through the opening in the blower tube.

5. OPERATION

WARNING: Do not allow familiarity with tools cause you to be careless. Remember that a careless fraction of a second is sufficient to inflict serious injury.

INSTALLING BATTERY PACK

See Figure 3.

- Place the battery pack in the blower's battery port. Align the raised ribs on the battery pack with the grooves in the blower's battery port.
- Make sure the latch on bottom of the battery pack snaps in place and that the battery pack is secured in the blower before beginning operation.

WARNING: When placing the battery pack in the blower, be sure the raised ribs on the battery pack align with the grooves in the top of the blower. Make sure the battery is fully seated, and it latches into place properly. Improper installation of the battery pack can cause damage to internal components.

REMOVING BATTERY PACK

See Figure 3.

- Release the trigger to stop the blower.
- Press and hold the latch button at the bottom of the battery pack.
- Remove battery pack from the blower.

CHARGING THE BATTERY

- Align the raised ribs on the battery pack with the grooves on the battery charger. Plug the charger into the electrical alimentation.
- You can see the charge status by pressing the charge level indicator which is on the battery. The battery is fully charged when all lights are switched on.

STARTING/STOPPING THE BLOWER

See Figure 4 and Figure 5

- To start the blower, press the lock button and push the trigger
- To stop the blower, release the trigger.

WARNING: Battery tools are always in operating condition. Therefore, operation trigger switch should always be in the OFF (released) position when not in use or carrying/moving the tool.

WARNING: Do not attempt to modify this tool or create accessories not recommended for use with this tool. Any such alteration or modification is misuse and could result in a hazardous condition leading to possible serious personal injury.

WARNING: Do not at any time let brake fluids, gasoline, petroleum based products, penetrating oils, etc. come in contact with plastic parts. They contain chemicals that can damage, weaken or destroy plastic.

OPERATING THE BLOWER

See Figure 6.

- To keep from scattering debris, blow around the outer edges of a debris pile. Never blow directly into the center of a pile.
- To reduce sound levels, limit the number of pieces of equipment used at any time.
- Use rakes and brooms to loosen debris before blowing. In dusty conditions, slightly dampen surfaces when water is available.
- Conserve water by using power blowers instead of hoses for many lawn and garden applications, including areas such as gutters, screens, patios, grills, porches, and gardens.
- Watch out for children, pets, open windows, or freshly washed cars, and blow debris safely away.
 After using blowers or other equipment, CLEAN UP! Dispose of debris properly.

See Figure 7.

Press the turbo button, to reach the maximum speed.

Press this button again to come to the normal speed.

6. MAINTENANCE AND SERVICING

When servicing use only original manufacturer's replacement parts, accessories and attachments. Use of any other parts may create a hazard or cause product damage.

Avoid using solvents when cleaning plastic parts. Most plastics are susceptible to damage from various types of commercial solvents and may be damaged by their use. Use clean cloths to remove dirt, dust, oil, grease, etc.

To avoid serious personal injury, always remove the battery pack from the tool when cleaning or performing any maintenance.

Do not at any time let brake fluids, gasoline, petroleum based products; penetrating oils, etc. come in contact with plastic parts. They contain chemicals that can damage, weaken or destroy plastic.

Do not attempt to modify this tool or create accessories not recommended for use with this tool. Any such alteration or modification is misuse and could result in a hazardous condition leading to possible serious personal injury.

Maintenance of the tool shall be performed by a qualified service.

STORING THE BLOWER

Clean the blower thoroughly before storing. Store the blower in a dry, well-ventilated place that is inaccessible to children. Keep away from corrosive agents such as garden chemicals and de-icing salts.

- Store and charge your batteries in a cool area. Temperatures above or below normal room temperature will shorten battery pack life.
- Never store batteries in a discharged condition. Wait for the battery pack to cool and fully charge immediately.
- All batteries gradually lose their charge. The higher the temperature, the quicker they lose their charge. If you
 store your unit for long periods of time without using it, recharge the batteries every month or two. This practice
 will prolong battery pack life.
