1. INTRODUCTION

Please make sure you familiarize yourself fully with the way the device works before you use it for the first time and that you understand how to handle electrical power tools correctly. To help you do this please read the accompanying operating instructions. Keep these instructions in a safe place. If you pass the device on to anyone else, please ensure that you also pass on all the documentation.

2. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

GENERAL POWER TOOL SAFETY WARNINGS



WARNING Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. *Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.*

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

1) Work area safety

- a) **Keep work area clean and well lit.** *Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.*
- b) **Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust.** *Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.*
- c) **Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool.** *Distractions can cause you to lose control.*

2) Electrical safety

- a) **Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools.** *Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.*
- b) **Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators.** *There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.*
- c) **Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions.** *Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.*
- d) **Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts.** *Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.*
- e) **When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use.** *Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.*
- f) **If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply.** *Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.*

3) Personal safety

- a) **Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication.** *A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.*
- b) **Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection.** *Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.*
- c) **Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool.** *Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.*

- d) **Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on.** *A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.*
- e) **Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** *This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.*
- f) **Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair and clothing away from moving parts.** *Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts.*
- g) **If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used.** *Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.*
- h) **Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool safety principles.** *A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.*

4) Power tool use and care

- a) **Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application.** *The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.*
- b) **Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off.** *Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.*
- c) **Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools.** *Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.*
- d) **Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool.**
Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- e) **Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use.** *Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.*
- f) **Keep cutting tools sharp and clean.** *Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.*
- g) **Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed.** *Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.*
- h) **Keep handles and grasping surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease.** *Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.*

5) Service

- a) **Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts.** *This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.*

Mixer safety instructions

- a) **Hold the tool with both hands at the intended handles.** *Loss of control can cause personal injury.*
- b) **Ensure sufficient ventilation when mixing flammable materials to avoid a hazardous atmosphere.** *Developing vapour may be inhaled or be ignited by the sparks the power tool produces.*
- c) **Do not mix food.** *Power tools and their accessories are not designed for processing food.*
- d) **Keep the cord away from the working area.** *The cord may be entangled by the mixer basket.*
- e) **Ensure that the mixing container is placed in a firm and secure position.** *A container that is not properly secured may move unexpectedly.*
- f) **Ensure that no liquid splashes against the housing of the power tool.** *Liquid that has penetrated the power tool can cause damage and lead to electric shock.*
- g) **Follow the instructions and warnings for the material to be mixed.** *Material to be mixed may be harmful.*
- h) **If the power tool falls into the material to be mixed, unplug the tool immediately and have the power tool checked by a qualified repair person.** *Reaching into the bucket with the tool still plugged in can lead to electric shock.*
- i) **Do not reach into the mixing container with your hands or insert any other objects into it while mixing.** *Contact with the mixer basket may lead to serious personal injury.*

j) **Start up and run down the tool in the mixing container only.** *The mixer basket may bend or spin in an uncontrolled manner.*

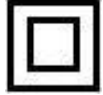

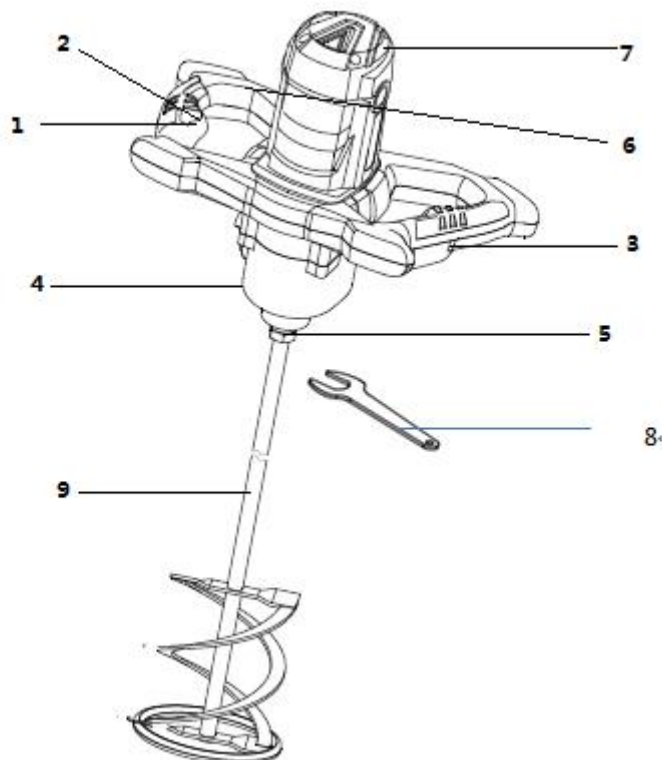

The machine is only intended for mixing concrete, cement or paint. Improper use may damage the tool. Any other use or modification to the device shall be considered as improper use and could give rise to considerable risk of accident. The manufacturer will not accept liability for loss or damage arising from improper use. The device is not intended for commercial use.

Information:

Caution utility services!

Original accessories / attachments

Use only the accessories and attachments detailed in the operating instructions.

The use of inserted tools or accessories other than those recommended in the operating instructions could lead to you suffering an injury.

5. BEFORE FIRST USE

WARNING! DANGER OF INJURY! Switch the device off and pull the plug out of the mains socket before carrying out any work in the device.

Placing a whisk

NOTE: Use only whisks in conformity the specified diameter.

- Screw the whisk with thread (M14) as far as possible in the tool.
- Tighten the whisk properly with an open-end wrench.

First use

The mains voltage at the mains socket must match with the data shown on the rating plate on the device.

6. OPERATION

Improper use may damage the instrument. Observe therefore these instructions:

- Use a tool up to the specified diameter.
 - Load the tool in such a way that the speed would not drop considerably or that it would stop.
- Check if the data on the rating plate correspond with the actual mains voltage.

Switching on and off

- To switch on the tool, push and hold the switch lock button. Then, press and hold the on/off switch (1). The lock switch button can be released.
- If you release the on/off switch, the tool will be switched off.

Infinitely adjustable speed setting

Two rpm ranges can be pre-selected with the speed selector switch (4):

Gear 1 180-400 /min

Gear 2 300-700 /min

The necessary speed depends on the type of the material mixed and it is recommended to verify it by a practical test.

7. MAINTENANCE CLEANING AND STORAGE

WARNING! DANGER OF INJURY!

Switch the device off and pull the plug out of the mains socket before carrying out any work on the device.

Correct maintenance for the machine can prolong the working life; the handle switch must always keep in proper function and good maintenance;

The mixing tools should be cleaned when the operation is finish or no use for long time; Use a cloth to clean the device.

Normally the flowing water or sand can clean the mixing tools well. Do not under any circumstances use petrol or strong solvents. Do not allow any liquids to enter the device.

Do not force any mechanical stress in the machine, such as pound, because it will be unavoidable damaged;

The mixing shaft must always be antipollution; the threaded hole must always be put protecting cover;

The vent of motor housing cannot be covered when the machine is in operation, there cannot be any flammable materials in the machine; the vent must be often cleaned;

Store the device & accessories in a dry room where out of the reach of children also.

Only original parts can be used in this machine.

The carbon brush must be checked and maintenance when the machine operation up to 60hours, please change the brush in time if find the brush worn out.

Loosen carbon brush cap first, Pull out and replace the carbon brush (Always replace the two brushes at the same time), screw carbon brush caps.

Service centre

WARNING! Have your device repaired only by qualified specialist personnel using original manufacturer parts only. This will ensure that your device remains safe to use.

WARNING! If the supply cord of this power tool is damaged, it must be replaced by a specially prepared supply cord available through the service organization.

- b) Make sure that your machine is complete with all accessories supplied, and clean! If this is not the case, the repairer will refuse the machine.

THE WARRANTY DOES NOT COVER:

- Start-up and setting up of the product.
- Damage resulting from normal wear and tear of the product.
- Damage resulting from improper use of the product.
- Damage resulting from assembly or start-up not in accordance with the user manual.
- Breakdowns related to carburetion beyond 90 days and fouling of carburetors.
- Periodic and standard maintenance events.
- Actions of modification and dismantling that directly void the warranty.
- Products whose original authentication marking (brand, serial number) has been degraded, altered or withdrawn.
- Replacement of consumables.
- The use of non-original parts.
- Breakage of parts following impacts or projections.
- Accessories breakdowns.
- Defects and their consequences linked to any external cause.
- Loss of components and loss due to insufficient screwing.
- Cutting components and any damage related to the loosening of parts.
- Overload or overheating.
- Poor power supply quality: faulty voltage, voltage error, etc.
- Damages resulting from the deprivation of enjoyment of the product during the time necessary for repairs and more generally the costs related to the immobilization of the product.
- The costs of a second opinion established by a third party following an estimate by a SWAP-Europe repair station
