

ORIGINAL INSTRUCTIONS



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1. INTENDED USE

The tool is designed to cut and cut wood or other materials in straight cutting lines while resting firmly on the workpiece. It is not designed for commercial use.



WARNING! For your own safety, read this manual and the general safety instructions carefully before using the appliance. Your power tool should only be given to other users together with these instructions.

2. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 GENERAL POWER TOOL SAFETY WARNING

WARNING Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with

this power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

1) Work area safety

a) Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.

b) Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. *Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.*

c) Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. *Distractions can cause you to lose control.*

2) Electrical safety

a) Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.

b) Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.

c) **Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions.** *Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.*

d) Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. *Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.*

e) When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use. Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.

f) If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.

3) Personal safety

a) Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.

b) **Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection.** *Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.*

c) Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. *Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.*

d) **Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on.** A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.

e) **Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.

f) Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair and clothing away from moving parts. *Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts.*

g) If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used. Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.

4) Power tool use and care

a) **Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application.** *The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.*

b) **Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off.** Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.

c) Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.

d) Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool.

Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.

e) Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. *Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.*

f) **Keep cutting tools sharp and clean.** Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.

g) Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.

5) Battery tool use and care

a) **Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer**. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.

b) **Use power tools only with specifically designated battery packs.** Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.

c) When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.

d) Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery; avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, additionally seek medical help. *Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.*

e) **Do not use a battery pack or tool that is damaged or modified**. *Damaged or modified batteries may exhibit unpredictable behaviour resulting in fire, explosion or risk of injury.*

f) **Do not expose a battery pack or tool to fire or excessive temperature**. *Exposure to fire or temperature above 130* °C *may cause explosion.*

g) Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the instructions. Charging improperly or at temperatures outside the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.

6) Service

a) **Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts.** *This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.*

b) Never service damaged battery packs. Service of battery packs should only be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service providers.

2.2 SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL OPERATIONS

Safety Warnings Common for Grinding, Sanding, Wire Brushing, Polishing or Abrasive Cutting-Off Operations:

a) This power tool is intended to function as a grinder and cut-off tool. Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

b) **Operations such as sanding, wire brushing and polishing are not recommended to be performed with this power tool.** *Operations for which the power tool was not designed may create a hazard and cause personal injury.*

c) **Do not use accessories which are not specifically designed and recommended by the tool manufacturer.** Just because the accessory can be attached to your power tool, it does not assure safe operation.

d) The rated speed of the accessory must be at least equal to the maximum speed marked on the **power tool.** Accessories running faster than their rated speed can break and fly apart.

e) The outside diameter and the thickness of your accessory must be within the capacity rating of your power tool. *Incorrectly sized accessories cannot be adequately guarded or controlled.*

f) Threaded mounting of accessories must match the grinder spindle thread. For accessories mounted by flanges, the arbour hole of the accessory must fit the locating diameter of the flange. Accessories that do not match the mounting hardware of the power tool will run out of balance, vibrate excessively and may cause loss of control.

g) Do not use a damaged accessory. Before each use inspect the accessory such as abrasive wheels for chips and cracks, backing pad for cracks, tear or excess wear, wire brush for loose or cracked wires. If power tool or accessory is dropped, inspect for damage or install an undamaged accessory. After inspecting and installing an accessory, position yourself and bystanders away from the plane of the rotating accessory and run the power tool at maximum no-load speed for one minute. Damaged accessories will normally break apart during this test time.

h) Wear personal protective equipment. Depending on application, use face shield, safety goggles or safety glasses. As appropriate, wear dust mask, hearing protectors, gloves and workshop apron capable of stopping small abrasive or workpiece fragments. The eye protection must be capable of stopping flying debris generated by various operations. The dust mask or respirator must be capable of filtrating particles generated by your operation. Prolonged exposure to high intensity noise may cause hearing loss.

i) Keep bystanders a safe distance away from work area. Anyone entering the work area must wear personal protective equipment. *Fragments of workpiece or of a broken accessory may fly away and cause injury beyond immediate area of operation.*

j) Hold the power tool by insulated gripping surfaces only, when performing an operation where the cutting accessory may contact hidden wiring or its own cord.

Cutting accessory contacting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.

k) **Position the cord clear of the spinning accessory.** *If you lose control, the cord may be cut or snagged and your hand or arm may be pulled into the spinning accessory.*

I) Never lay the power tool down until the accessory has come to a complete stop. The spinning accessory may grab the surface and pull the power tool out of your control.

m) **Do not run the power tool while carrying it at your side.** Accidental contact with the spinning accessory could snag your clothing, pulling the accessory into your body.

n) **Regularly clean the power tool's air vents.** *The motor's fan will draw the dust inside the housing and excessive accumulation of powdered metal may cause electrical hazards.*

o) Do not operate the power tool near flammable materials. Sparks could ignite these materials.

p) **Do not use accessories that require liquid coolants.** Using water or other liquid coolants may result in electrocution or shock.

2.3 FURTHER SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR ALL OPERATIONS

Kickback and Related Warnings

Kickback is a sudden reaction to a pinched or snagged rotating wheel, backing pad, brush or any other accessory. Pinching or snagging causes rapid stalling of the rotating accessory which in turn causes the uncontrolled power tool to be forced in the direction opposite of the accessory's rotation at the point of the binding.

For example, if an abrasive wheel is snagged or pinched by the workpiece, the edge of the wheel that is entering into the pinch point can dig into the surface of the material causing the wheel to climb out or kick out. The wheel may either jump toward or away from the operator, depending on direction of the wheel's movement at the point of pinching. Abrasive wheels may also break under these conditions.

Kickback is the result of power tool misuse and/or incorrect operating procedures or conditions and can be avoided by taking proper precautions as given below.

a) Maintain a firm grip on the power tool and position your body and arm to allow you to resist kickback forces. Always use auxiliary handle, if provided, for maximum control over kickback or torque reaction during start-up. The operator can control torque reactions or kickback forces, if proper precautions are taken.

b) Never place your hand near the rotating accessory. Accessory may kickback over your hand.
c) Do not position your body in the area where power tool will move if kickback occurs. Kickback will propel the tool in direction opposite to the wheel's movement at the point of snagging.

d) **Use special care when working corners, sharp edges etc. Avoid bouncing and snagging the accessory.** *Corners, sharp edges or bouncing have a tendency to snag the rotating accessory and cause loss of control or kickback.*

e) **Do not attach a saw chain woodcarving blade or toothed saw blade.** Such blades create frequent kickback and loss of control.

2.4 ADDITIONAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR GRINDING AND CUTTING-OFF OPERATIONS Safety Warnings Specific for Grinding and Abrasive Cutting-Off Operations:

a) Use only wheel types that are recommended for your power tool and the specific guard designed for the selected wheel. Wheels for which the power tool was not designed cannot be adequately guarded and are unsafe.

b) The grinding surface of centre depressed wheels must be mounted below the plane of the guard lip. An improperly mounted wheel that projects through the plane of the guard lip cannot be adequately protected.

c) The guard must be securely attached to the power tool and positioned for maximum safety, so the least amount of wheel is exposed towards the operator. The guard helps to protect the operator from broken wheel fragments, accidental contact with wheel and sparks that could ignite clothing.

d) Wheels must be used only for recommended applications. For example: do not grind with the side

of cut-off wheel. Abrasive cut-off wheels are intended for peripheral grinding, side forces applied to these wheels may cause them to shatter.

e) Always use undamaged wheel flanges that are of correct size and shape for your selected wheel. Proper wheel flanges support the wheel thus reducing the possibility of wheel breakage. Flanges for cut-off wheels may be different from grinding wheel flanges.

f) **Do not use worn down wheels from larger power tools.** Wheel intended for larger power tool is not suitable for the higher speed of a smaller tool and may burst.

2.5 ADDITIONAL SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR CUTTING-OFF OPERATIONS

Additional Safety Warnings Specific for Abrasive Cutting-Off Operations:

a) **Do not "jam" the cut-off wheel or apply excessive pressure. Do not attempt to make an excessive depth of cut.** Overstressing the wheel increases the loading and susceptibility to twisting or binding of the wheel in the cut and the possibility of kickback or wheel breakage.

b) **Do not position your body in line with and behind the rotating wheel.** When the wheel, at the point of operation, is moving away from your body, the possible kickback may propel the spinning wheel and the power tool directly at you.

c) When wheel is binding or when interrupting a cut for any reason, switch off the power tool and hold the power tool motionless until the wheel comes to a complete stop. Never attempt to remove the cut-off wheel from the cut while the wheel is in motion otherwise kickback may occur. *Investigate and take corrective action to eliminate the cause of wheel binding.*

d) Do not restart the cutting operation in the workpiece. Let the wheel reach full speed and carefully re-enter the cut. The wheel may bind, walk up or kickback if the power tool is restarted in the workpiece.

e) **Support panels or any oversized workpiece to minimize the risk of wheel pinching and kickback.** Large workpieces tend to sag under their own weight. Supports must be placed under the workpiece near the line of cut and near the edge of the workpiece on both sides of the wheel.

f) Use extra caution when making a "pocket cut" into existing walls or other blind areas. The protruding wheel may cut gas or water pipes, electrical wiring or objects that can cause kickback.

2.6 SPECIFIC SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR ANGLE GRINDERS

- Check that the maximum speed indicated on the grinding disc corresponds to the maximum speed of the machine. The speed of the machine must not exceed the value on the grinding disc.
- Make sure that the dimensions of the grinding disc correspond to the specifications of the machine.
- Make sure that the grinding disc has been mounted and fastened properly. Do not use reducing rings or adapters to make the grinding disc fit properly.
- Treat and store grinding discs in conformance with the supplier's instructions.
- Do not use the machine for grinding workpieces with a maximum thickness exceeding the maximum grinding depth of the grinding disc.
- Do not use grinding discs for deburring.
- When grinding discs have to be mounted on the thread of the spindle, make sure that the spindle has sufficient thread. Make sure that the spindle is sufficiently protected and does not touch the grinding surface.
- Before use, inspect the grinding disc for any damage. Do not use grinding discs which are cracked, ripped or otherwise damaged.
- Before use, let the machine run idle for 30 seconds.
- Immediately switch off the machine in case of abnormal vibrations or occurrence of another defect. Carefully inspect the machine and grinding disc before switching the machine on again.
- Make sure that sparks do not put people into danger or that they contact highly flammable substances.
- Make sure that the workpiece is sufficiently supported or clamped. Keep your hands away from the surface to be cut.
- Always wear safety goggles and hearing protection. If desired or required also use another kind of protection like for example an apron or helmet.
- Ensure that mounted wheels and points are fitted in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Ensure that blotters are used when they are provided with the bonded abrasive product and when they

are required.

- If a guard is supplied with the tool never use the tool without such a guard.
- For tools intended to be fitted with threaded hole wheel, ensure that the thread in the wheel is long enough to accept the spindle length.
- Ensure that ventilation openings are kept clear when working in dusty conditions.

2.7 SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR BATTERIES AND CHARGER

Batteries

- Never attempt to open for any reason.
- Do not store in locations where the temperature may exceed 50°C.
- Charge only at ambient temperatures between 5°C and 50°C
- Charge only using the charger provided with the tool.
- Store your batteries in a cool dry place (5°C-20°C/41°F-68°F). Never store batteries in discharged state.
- It is better for Li-ion batteries to discharge and reload them regularly (at least 4 times a year). The ideal charge for long-term storage of your Li-ion battery is 40% of capacity.
- When disposing of batteries, follow the instructions given in the section "Protecting the environment".
- Do not cause short circuits. If connection is made between the positive (+) and negative (-) terminal directly or via accidental contact with metallic objects, the battery is short circuited and an intense current will flow causing heat generation which may lead to casing rupture or fire.
- Do not heat. If batteries are heated to above 100°C (212°F), sealing and insulating separators and other polymer components may be damaged resulting in electrolyte leakage and/or internal short circuiting leading to heat generation causing rupture or file. Moreover, do not dispose of the batteries in fire, explosion and/or intense burning may result.
- Under extreme conditions, battery leakage may occur. When you notice liquid on the battery, proceed as follows:
 - ✓ Carefully wipe the liquid off using a cloth. Avoid skin contact.
 - ✓ In case of skin or eye contact, follow the instructions below:
 - Immediately rinse with water. Neutralize with a mild acid such as lemon juice or vinegar.
 - In case of eye contact, rinse abundantly with clean water for at least 10 minutes. Consult a physician.



Fire hazard! Avoid short-circuiting the contacts of a detached battery. Do not incinerate the battery.

Charger

- . Use the charger provided with the tool only to charge the battery.
- . Never attempt to charge non-rechargeable batteries.
- . Have defective cords replaced immediately.
- . Do not expose to water.
- . Do not open the charger.
- . Do not probe the charger.
- . The charger is intended for indoor use only.
- This charger can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical,

sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.


- Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

CAUTION: Do not recharge non-rechargeable batteries.

Information

6. OPERATION

6.1 CHARGING (FIG, C)

IMPORTANT: The battery pack is not fully charged at the factory. Before attempting to charge them, thoroughly read all of the safety instructions.

- 1) To assure that the charger (8) you use are applicable to the battery pack (9).
- 2) Insert the charger into 220-240V~, 50-60Hz outlet. The indicator light (15) become to green light to show the power is connected.
- 3) Insert the battery (4) into the slot of charger (14). Make sure the contact with the charger is correct.
- 4) The indicator light of charger (15) become to red when charging.
- 5) When fully charged The indicator light (15) become to green light.
- 6) Frequently monitor the charger and battery pack while connected.
- 7) Unplug the charger and disconnect it from the battery pack when finished.
- 8) Allow the battery pack to cool completely before using it.
- 9) Store the charger and battery pack indoors, out of reach of children.

NOTE: If the battery does not fit properly, disconnect it and confirm that the battery pack is the correct model for this charger as shown on the specification chart. Do not charge any other battery pack or any battery pack that does not securely fit the charger.

NOTE: If battery is hot after continuous use in the tool, allow it to cool down to room temperature before charging.

This will extend the life of your batteries.

6.2 INSTALLING THE BATTERY PACK (FIG. D2)

Warning! Always remove battery pack from your tool when you are assembling parts, making adjustments, cleaning, carrying, transporting or when not in use. Removing battery pack will prevent accidental starting that could cause serious personal injury.

NOTE: To avoid serious personal injury, always remove the battery pack and keep hands clear of the lock-out button when carrying or transporting the tool.

Insert the battery pack into the tool base, make sure the battery pack snaps into place and that battery pack is secured in the tool before beginning operation. Improper installation of the battery pack can cause damage to internal components.

6.3 BATTERY CAPACITY INDICATOR

There are battery capacity indicators (13) on the tool; you can check the capacity status of the battery if you press the trigger switch (1). Before using the machine, please press switch trigger to check if the battery is full enough for properly working. Those 3 LED might show the status of the capacity level of the battery

6.4 REMOVING THE BATTERY PACK (FIG. D1)

Locate the battery release button (3) on the battery and press downwards, while holding down the battery release catch take the battery pack away from the tool.

6.5 SWITCHING ON / OFF (FIG.E1, E2)

Before engage the ON/OFF switch button, check that the grinding disc is properly fitted and run smoothly, the outer flange is well tightened.

- Connect the battery pack onto the angle grinder body.
- To switch on the angle grinder, push the On/Off switch (1) to the right a little and then forward to catch the lock-fixed slot.
- When you press the switch "O", the tool returns off.

6.6 CHANGING THE BLADE


- Before making any changes to the tool, unplug the saw
- Wear protective gloves when mounting the saw blade. there is danger of injury from touching the saw blade
- Only use saw blades that correspond to the characteristic data given in the operating instructions
- Do not under any circumstances use abrasive discs as cutting
- 1) Take off the guard (FIG.A2, A3)
- 2) Depress and hold down the shalf lock button (5) to secure the spindle.
- 3) Turn the spindle with the hexagonal tool until it releases
- 4) Loosen the clamping bolt, remove it and the washer (FIG.B1).
- 5) Assemble the blade on the spindle (FIG.B2),
- 6) Replace the washer and bolt then screw it in.
- 7) Reassemble the protection.


6.7 SPEED ADJUSTMENT (FIG. G, H)


This tool has 6 speed positions. The maximum speed is 19500/min. Turn the dial to select the desired speed.


6.8 OPERATON MODES (FIG. H, I, J)


- Hold the handle firmly and switch on. Avoid blocking the ventilation slots with your hand, as this may cause the grinder to overheat. Let the disc reach full speed at horizontal and vertical. Apply the grinder to the item.
- Maximum effect is achieved when the grinder is held at an angle of 15-30° in relation to the item. Move the grinder gently along the item. Give the grinder time to work. It is rarely necessary to press the disc hard against the surface to be worked. Sparks can occur in the motor compartment during use. This is normal and does not mean the grinder is defective. Switch off the grinder after use.




















7. CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

Always disconnect the battery pack from the angle grinder before making any adjustment or attaching any accessories.

6.1 Cleaning

- Keep the ventilation slots of the machine clean to prevent overheating of the engine.
- Regularly clean the machine housing with a soft cloth, preferably after each use.
- Keep the ventilation slots free from dust and dirt.
- If the dirt does not come off use a soft cloth moistened with soapy water.

Never use solvents such as petrol, alcohol, ammonia water, etc. These solvents may damage the plastic parts.

6.2 Lubrication

The machine does not require any specific lubrication.

8. STORAGE

- Thoroughly clean the whole machine and its accessories.
- Store it out of the reach of children, in a stable and secure position, in a cool and dry place, avoid too high and too low temperatures.
- Protect it from exposure to direct sunlight. Keep it in the dark, if possible.
- Don't keep it in plastic bags to avoid humidity build-up.
