

1. APPLICATION

The power tool is intended for driving and drilling through wood, metal, plastics and masonry. Not suitable for professional use.



WARNING! Read this manual and general safety instructions carefully before using the appliance, for your own safety. Your power tool should only be passed on together with these instructions.

2. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

A

WARNING Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this

power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury. Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

- 1) Work area safety
- a) Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- b) Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- c) Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.
- 2) Electrical safety
- a) Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- b) Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- c) **Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions**. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock
- d) Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.
- e) When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use. Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.
- f) If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.
- 3) Personal safety
- a) Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.
- b) **Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection.** Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.
- c) Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- d) Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on. A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.
- e) **Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.
- f) Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair and clothing away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts.

- g) If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used. Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.
- h) Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool safety principles. A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.
- 4) Power tool use and care
- a) **Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application.** The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.
- b) **Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off.** Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- c) Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.
- d) Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool.

Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.

- e) Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- f) **Keep cutting tools sharp and clean.** Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
- g) Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.
- h) **Keep handles and grasping surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease.** Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.
- 5) Battery tool use and care
- a) Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- b) **Use power tools only with specifically designated battery packs**. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.
- c) When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- d) Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery; avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, additionally seek medical help. Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.
- e) **Do not use a battery pack or tool that is damaged or modified**. Damaged or modified batteries may exhibit unpredictable behaviour resulting in fire, explosion or risk of injury.
- f) **Do not expose a battery pack or tool to fire or excessive temperature**. Exposure to fire or temperature above 130 °C may cause explosion.

NOTE The temperature "130 °C" can be replaced by the temperature "265 °F".

- g) Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the instructions. Charging improperly or at temperatures outside the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.
- 6) Service
- a) Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.
- b) **Never service damaged battery packs**. Service of battery packs should only be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service providers.

Drill safety warnings

- Wear ear protectors when impact drilling. Exposure to noise can cause hearing loss.
- Use auxiliary handle(s), if supplied with the tool. Loss of control can cause personal injury.

Hold power tool by insulated gripping surfaces, when performing an operation where the cutting accessory may contact hidden wiring. Cutting accessory contacting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.

Safety instructions when using long drill bits

- a) **Never operate at higher speed than the maximum speed rating of the drill bit.** At higher speeds, the bit is likely to bend if allowed to rotate freely without contacting the workpiece, resulting in personal injury.
- b) Always start drilling at low speed and with the bit tip in contact with the workpiece. At higher speeds, the bit is likely to bend if allowed to rotate freely without contacting the workpiece, resulting in personal injury.
- c) Apply pressure only in direct line with the bit and do not apply excessive pressure. Bits can bend causing breakage or loss of control, resulting in personal injury.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR BATTERIES AND CHARGER

Batteries

- Never attempt to open for any reason.
- Do not store in locations where the temperature may exceed 40°C (104°F).
- The recommended ambient temperature range for the charging system during charging is 4°C to 40°C.
- The recommended ambient temperature range for tool and battery use is -5°C to 40°C.
- Charge only using the charger provided with the tool.
- Store your batteries in a cool dry place (5°C-20°C/41°F-68°F). Never store batteries in discharged state.
- It is better for Li-ion batteries to discharge and reload them regularly (at least 4 times a year). The ideal charge for long-term storage of your Li-ion battery is 40% of capacity.
- When disposing of batteries, follow the instructions given in the section "Protecting the environment".
- Do not cause short circuits. If connection is made between the positive (+) and negative (-) terminal directly or via accidental contact with metallic objects, the battery is short circuited and an intense current will flow causing heat generation which may lead to casing rupture or fire.
- Do not heat. If batteries are heated to above 100°C (212°F), sealing and insulating separators and other polymer components may be damaged resulting in electrolyte leakage and/or internal short circuiting leading to heat generation causing rupture or fire. Moreover do not dispose of the batteries in fire, explosion and/or intense burning may result.
- Under extreme conditions, battery leakage may occur. When you notice liquid on the battery, proceed as follows:
 - ✓ Carefully wipe the liquid off using a cloth. Avoid skin contact.
 - ✓ In case of skin or eye contact, follow the instructions below:
 - · Immediately rinse with water. Neutralize with a mild acid such as lemon juice or vinegar.
 - In case of eye contact, rinse abundantly with clean water for at least 10 minutes. Consult a physician.



Fire hazard! Avoid short-circuiting the contacts of a detached battery. Do not incinerate the battery.

Charger

- Use the charger provided with the tool only to charge the battery.
- . Never attempt to charge non-rechargeable batteries.
- . Have defective cords replaced immediately.
- . Do not expose to water.
- . Do not open the charger.
- Do not probe the charger.
- . The charger is intended for indoor use only.
- This charger can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved.
- Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children without supervision.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.

CAUTION: Do not recharge non-rechargeable batteries.



4. FEATURES

4.1 Li-ion battery (5)

Advantages of Li-ion batteries:

- Li-ion batteries have a higher capacity/weight ratio (more power for less heavy, more compact, battery)
- No memory effect (capacity loss after several charge/discharge cycles) like other type batteries.
- Limited self-discharge.

4.2 Keyless chuck (1)

Your drill has a keyless chuck that allows you to hand tighten or release drill bit in the chuck jaws.

4.3 Torque adjustment ring (2)

The drill has a torque adjustment ring. It allows you to select the desired torque depending on the task you have to perform (screwing / different types of screws into different materials). The proper setting depends on the type of material and the size of screw you are using.

4.4 Forward/reverse selector (right/left rotation selector) (6)

The drill has a forward/reverse selector located above the switch trigger.

CAUTION: To prevent damage to the gearbox, always allow the chuck to come to a complete stop before changing the direction of rotation or selecting another speed (HI-LO). To stop, release the trigger switch.

4.5 Variable speed

Your cordless drill has a variable speed switch. The rotational speed and torque will in-/ decrease equivalently to applied trigger pressure. This drill has an electric brake, when the trigger switch is released, the chuck stops turning.

4.6 Speed selector (3)

Your cordless drill has a two-speed gear, designed for drilling or driving at LO (1) or HI (2) speed. A slide switch is located on top of your drill to select either LO (1) or HI (2) speed.

4.7 LED light (7)

Your cordless drill is equipped with an LED light at the front, above the battery pack

4.8 TPR soft grip

Your cordless drill is equipped with TPR soft grip and protective parts. TPR (Thermoplastic rubber) is elastic, chock absorbing and environmental friendly (recyclable).

5. OPERATION

5.1 Charging the battery pack

IMPORTANT: The battery pack is not fully charged at the factory. Before attempting to charge them, thoroughly read all of the safety instructions.

- 1) To assure that the charger you use are applicable to the battery pack.
- 2) Insert the charger into 220-240V~,50-60Hz outlet. Do not use an extension cord.

The green light(2) will light to show the power is connected.

- 3)Slide the battery into the charger. Make sure the contact with the charger is correct.
- 4) When charging the red light (1) will be constantly lit
- 5) When fully charged the green light(2) will be constantly lit.
- 6). Frequently monitor the charger and battery pack while connected.
- 7). For a fully discharged battery or a new battery, allow the battery pack to charge for 1-2 hours. The green lights will stay on (not flash) when the battery is finished charging.
- 8). Unplug the charger and disconnect it from the battery pack when finished.
- 9). Allow the battery pack to cool completely before using it.
- 10). Store the charger and battery pack indoors, out of reach of children.



Note: If the battery does not fit properly, disconnect it and confirm that the battery pack is the correct model for this charger as shown on the specification chart. Do not charge any other battery pack or any battery pack that does not securely fit the charger.



NOTE: If battery is hot after continuous use in the tool, allow it to cool down to room temperature before charging. This will extend the life of your batteries.

NOTE:Remove battery pack from charger stand which use your thumb or fingers, press the battery's release button in and pull the battery pack off at the same time.

Battery capacity indicator (Fig. 1a)

There are battery capacity indicators on the battery pack; you can check the capacity status of the battery if you squeeze the button. Before using the machine, please press switch trigger to check if the battery is full enough for properly working.

Those 3 LED might show the status of the capacity level of the battery: Inserting and removing the battery.

WARNING: Before making any adjustments ensure the drill is switched off with the direction of the battery.

WARNING: Before making any adjustments ensure the drill is switched off with the direction of rotation selector in the center position

- 1. Remove the battery: press the battery release latch in and at the same time pull the battery pack off.
- 2. To insert the battery, push the battery pack onto the contacts of the tool.

5.2 Installing and Removing a Bit and a Drill

This drill has a keyless chuck to prevent the bit or drill from loosening and allows you to hand tighten or release drill bit in the chuck jaws.



- 1. Turn ring A anticlockwise with the other hand until the drill chuck opening is large enough to accept the tool.
- 2. Insert the drill or the screwdriver bit into the drill chuck.
- 3. Turn ring A clockwise until the tool is clamped tightly.
- 4. Remove the tool in the opposite way.

1) Switch (4)

The drill is started and stopped by depressing and releasing the ON/OFF switch trigger.

2) Switch lock

The switch trigger can be locked in the center position.

This helps to reduce the possibility of accidental starting when not in use. To lock the switch trigger, place the direction of rotation selector in the center position.

3) Direction of rotation

Direction of rotation is controlled by the direction of rotation selector located above the switch trigger.

4) Clockwise rotation:

Right: To select forward rotation, release the on/off switch and push the forward/reverse lever to the left side of the tool.

5) Anticlockwise rotation:

Left: To select reverse rotation, push the lever to the right side of the tool.

6) Variable speed

This tool has a variable speed switch that delivers higher speed and torque with increased trigger pressure. Speed is controlled by the amount of switch trigger depression.

7) Adjusting the torque

The torque is adjusted by rotating the torque setting ring; the torque is greater when the torque setting is set on a higher position. The torque is less when the torque setting ring is set on a low position "1" denotes lowest and "21" denote highest.

Torque is set by means of a torque setting according to different screw and different material, you can adjust suitable torque, if the screw is long and material is hard, you can adjust the bigger setting.

8) Function mode selector

- Turn the function mode selector and let the pointer align to the impact mode **T** that selects the impact mode of action.
- Turn the function mode selector and let the pointer align to the drill mode at that selects the drill mode of action.
- Turn the function mode selector and let the pointer align to the screwdriver mode that selects the screwdriver mode of action.

9) Speed selector

The drill has a two-speed gear train designed for drilling at 1 (LOW) or 2 (HIGH) speed. A gear selector is located on top of the drill to select either low or high speed. When you push the button forward and select low speed range, the speed will decrease but will provide more power and torque. When using drill in the high-speed range. Speed will increase but will provide less power and torque. Use low speed for high power and torque application and high speed for fast drilling applications.



Important: NEVER adjust this two-speed selector whilst the drill is running. Always let it come to a complete stop first.

10) LED light

The LED work-light can light prior to motor running if you press the switch lightly, which keep the work area to be lighted for checking clearly at first, and it lights also during your operation.



WARNING: Do not stare directly at the light beam. Never aim the beam at any person or an object other than the work piece.



Do not deliberately aim the beam at personnel and ensure that it is not directed towards the eye of a person for longer than 0.25s.

11) DRILLING

(1) Drilling

Before use for drilling, the function mode selector should be set on drill position "2".



When drilling hard smooth surface, use a center punch to mark the desired hole location. This will prevent the drill bit from slipping off center as the hole is started. Hold the tool firmly and place the tip of the drill or bit into the work piece, applying only enough pressure to keep the bit cutting. Do not force or apply side pressure to elongate a hole.

(2) Wood drilling

For maximum performance, use high speed steel bits for wood drilling. Turn the function mode selector on the drill

mode " Begin drilling at a very low speed to prevent the bit from slipping off the starting point. Increase the speed as the drill bit bites into the material. When drilling through holes, place a block of wood behind the workpiece to prevent ragged or sintered edges on the back side of the hole.

(3) Metal drilling

For maximum performance, use high speed steel bits for metal or steel drilling. Turn the function mode selector on the

drill mode " a.". Begin drilling at a very low speed to prevent the bit from slipping off the starting point. Maintain a speed and pressure which allows cutting without overheating the bit.

Applying too much pressure will:

- -Overheat the drill
- -Wear the bearings
- -Bend or burn bits
- -Produce off-center or irregular shaped holes

When drilling large holes in metal, it is recommended that you drill with a small bit at first, then finish with a large bit. Also, lubricate the bit with oil to improve drilling action and increase bit life.

(4) Driving screw

- -For maximum performance, use good quality bits for driving screws, turn the function mode selector on the screwdriver mode position "21".
- -Fix the torque setting low enough to allow a safety margin. Use a very low torque setting when first driving small screws into soft materials. Then adjust the setting as the proper force required is determined.

NOTE: The torque setting required depends on the item being driven. In the case of screws, consider the size, length, and type of material.

(5) Hammer Setting

- -For maximum performance, use a good quality masonry bit for hammer drill, turn the function mode selector on the impact mode position "\bar{\mathbf{T}}".
- Only use this setting to bore or drill into stone/concrete. The Hammer setting works well when drilling/chipping into materials.

The tip of tool MUST be firmly depressed for the hammer action to engage.

NOTE: Only use a masonry bit when drilling into masonry materials.

6. CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

Cleaning

Keep the ventilation slots of the machine clean to prevent overheating of the engine.

Regularly clean the machine housing with a soft cloth, preferably after each use.

Keep the ventilation slots free from dust and dirt.

If the dirt does not come off use a soft cloth moistened with soapy water.

Never use solvents such as petrol, alcohol, ammonia water, etc. These solvents may damage the plastic parts.

Maintenance

Our machines have been designed to operate over a long period of time with a minimum of maintenance. Continuous satisfactory operation depends upon proper machine care and regular cleaning.

Storage

Remove the battery from the tool.

Store the tool in a dry place and protected from freezing, the ambient temperature should not exceed 40 c.

Put it out of the reach of children.

















1)Charging the battery pack

IMPORTANT: The battery pack is not fully charged at the factory.

Before attempting to charge them, thoroughly read all of the safety instructions.

- 1) To assure that the charger you use are applicable to the battery pack.
- 2) Insert the charger into 220-240V~,50-60Hz outlet. Do not use an extension cord.

The green light(2) will light to show the power is connected.

3)Slide the battery into the charger. Make sure the contact with the charger

is correct.

- 4) When charging the red light (1) will be constantly lit
- 5) When fully charged the green light(2) will be constantly lit.
- 6). Frequently monitor the charger and battery pack while connected.
- 7). For a fully discharged battery or a new battery, allow the battery pack to charge for 1-2 hours. The green lights will stay on (not flash) when the battery is finished charging.
- 8). Unplug the charger and disconnect it from the battery pack when finished.
- 9). Allow the battery pack to cool completely before using it.
- 10). Store the charger and battery pack indoors, out of reach of children.



Note: If the battery does not fit properly, disconnect it and confirm that the battery pack is the correct model for this charger as shown on the specification chart. Do not charge any other battery pack or any battery pack that does not securely fit the charger.



NOTE: If battery is hot after continuous use in the tool, allow it to cool down to room temperature before charging. This will extend the life of your batteries.



NOTE: Remove battery pack from charger stand which use your thumb or fingers, press the battery's release button in and pull the battery pack off at the same time.

Battery capacity indicator

There are battery capacity indicators on the battery pack; you can check the capacity status of the battery if you squeeze the button. Before using the machine, please press switch trigger to check if the battery is full enough for properly working.

Those 3 LED might show the status of the capacity level of the battery: Inserting and removing the battery.



WARNING: Before making any adjustments ensure the drill is switched off with the direction of rotation selector in the center position

- 1. Remove the battery: press the battery release latch in and at the same time pull the battery pack off.
- 2. To insert the battery, push the battery pack onto the contacts of the tool.



2) MOUNTING THE TOOL (See Fig. C1-C3)



CAUTION: Ensure the battery is removed from the jigsaw before changing blades or making any adjustments.

Always wear protective gloves when changing accessories (tools) as the edges may be sharp and could cause injury. The accessories (tools) can become very hot during use so please exercise caution when replacing to avoid burns and other injuries.



WARNING: To reduce the risk of injury, do not let the universal end cut blades or any segment saw blades face toward the user's hand.

- Loosen the Flange

Use the allen key to rotate the flange clockwise. (See Fig. C1)

- Insert Accessories

Insert the accessory onto the accessory holder. (See Fig. C2)

-Tighten the Flange

Use the allen key to rotate the flange counterclockwise until accessory is tightened securely. (See Fig. C3)

3) MOUNTING / CHANGING THE SANDING SHEET(See Fig. D)

Align the sanding sheet and press it onto the sanding plate by hand.

Firmly press the power tool with the sanding sheet against a flat surface and briefly switch the power tool on. This provides for good adhesion and prevents premature wear.

If one point has become worn, pull off the sanding sheet, turn it 120° and place it on again.

4) OPERATING THE ON/OFF SWITCH (See Fig. E)

- Switching the power tool ON: Slide switch (1) forward (I).
- Switching the power tool OFF: Slide switch (1) backward (0).

5) 5USING THE VARIABLE SPEED CONTROL (See Fig. F)

Select oscillation frequency (speed) while the motor is running.

The variable speed control (4) can be used to set the optimum oscillating frequency according to the accessories used and the respective application.

High oscillation frequency: Sanding, sawing, rasping and polishing stone and metal.

Low oscillation frequency: Polishing varnishes.

6) SANDING

Typical application: wood, metal; small areas, especially corners, edges and places difficult to access.

Select high oscillation frequency.

Sand with a constant movement and light pressure.

Heavy pressure does not increase the removal – the sanding sheet merely wears faster.

7) SAWING WITH THE SEMICIRCLE SAW BLADE

The workpiece must be inserted firmly or clamped tightly before it is cut.

Typical application: wood, PVC, soft metal sheet.

Select high oscillation frequency.

The saw blade lasts longer if the wear is distributed evenly. To ensure an even distribution, loosen the saw blade, rotate it and retighten firmly.

B) SAWING WITH THE END CUT SAW BLADE (SEE Fig. G



WARNING: the sawing teeth are very sharp. Do not touch during mounting and application.

The workpiece must be inserted firmly or clamped tightly before it is cut.

Typical application: wood, plaster board, soft plastics and metal (e.g. nails).

When plunging and sawing use a slight pendulum motion, to allow sufficient chip removal.

9) SCRAPING

Typical application: Scraping off old varnish or adhesives, removing glued carpeting, e. g. on stairs or other small to medium-sized surfaces.

Select medium / high oscillation frequency.

5. MAINTENANCE

WARNING! Always remove battery pack from your tool when you are assembling parts, making adjustments, cleaning, or when not in use. Removing battery pack will prevent accidental starting that could cause serious personal injury. This power tool normally requires no maintenance; from time to time the ventilation slots on the motor casing should be cleaned out. If the unit should become defective, repair should be performed by an authorized service agent for electric tools.

The tool may be cleaned most effectively with compressed dry air. Always wear safety goggles when cleaning tools with compressed air.

1. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

- 1) Work area safety
- a) Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- b) Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- c) Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.
- 2) Electrical safety

- c) Adjust the cutting depth to the thickness of the workpiece. Less than a full tooth of the blade teeth should be visible below the workpiece.
- d) Never hold piece being cut in your hands or across your leg. Secure the workpiece to a stable platform. It is important to support the work properly to minimize body exposure, blade binding, or loss of control.
- e) Hold power tool by insulated gripping surfaces when performing an operation where the cutting tool may contact hidden wiring or its own cord. Contact with a "live" wire will also make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and shock the operator.
- f) When ripping always use a rip fence or straight edge guide. This improves the accuracy of cut and reduces the chance of blade binding.
- **g)** Always use blades with correct size and shape (diamond versus round) of arbor holes. Blades that do not match the mounting hardware of the saw will run eccentrically, causing loss of control.
- h) Never use damaged or incorrect blade washers or bolt. The blade washers and bolt were specially designed for your saw, for optimum performance and safety of operation.

Special safety regulations

Causes and operator prevention of kickback:

- Kickback is a sudden reaction to a pinched, bound or misaligned saw blade, causing an uncontrolled saw to lift up and out of the workpiece toward the operator;
- When the blade is pinched or bound tightly by the kerf closing down, the blade stalls and the motor reaction drives the unit rapidly back toward the operator;
- If the blade becomes twisted or misaligned in the cut, the teeth at the back edge of the blade can dig into the top surface of the wood causing the blade to climb out of the kerf and jump back toward the operator.
- Kickback is the result of saw misuse and/or in corrects operating procedures or conditions and can be avoided by taking proper precautions as given below.
- a) Maintain a firm grip with both hands on the saw and position your arms to resist kickback forces. Position your body to either side of the blade, but not in line with the blade. Kick back could cause the saw to jump backwards, but kickback forces can be controlled by the operator, if proper precautions are taken.
- b) When blade is binding, or when interrupting a cut for any reason, release the trigger and hold the saw motionless in the material until the blade comes to a complete stop. Never attempt to remove the saw from the work or pull the saw backward while the blade is in motion or kickback may occur. Investigate and take

corrective actions to eliminate the cause of blade binding.

- c) When restarting a saw in the workpiece, center the saw blade in the kerf and check that saw teeth are not engaged into the material. If saw blade is binding, it may walk up or kickback from the workpiece as the saw is restarted.
- d) Support large panels to minimize the risk of blade pinching and kickback. Large panels tend to sag under their own weight. Supports must be placed under the panel on both sides, near the line of cut and near the edge of the panel.
- e) Do not use dull or damaged blades. Unsharpened or improperly set blades produce narrow kerf causing excessive friction, blade binding and kickback.
- f) Blade depth and bevel adjusting locking levers must be tight and secure before making cut. If blade adjustment shifts while cutting, it may cause binding and kickback.
- g) Use extra caution when making a "plunge cut" into existing walls or other blind areas. The protruding blade may cut objects that can cause kickback.

Safety instructions for the saw

- a) Check lower guard for proper closing before each use. Do not operate the saw if lower guard does not move freely and close instantly. Never clamp or tie the lower guard into the open position. If saw is accidentally dropped, lower guard may be bent. Raise the lower guard with the retracting handle and make sure it moves freely and does not touch the blade or any other part, in all angles and depths of cut.
- b) Check the operation of the lower guard spring. If the guard and the spring are not operating properly, they must be serviced before use. Lower guard may operate sluggishly due to damaged parts, gummy deposits, or a build-up of debris.
- c) Lower guard may be retracted manually only for special cuts such as "plunge cuts" and "compound cuts." Raise lower guard by retracting handle and as soon as blade enters the material, the lower guard must be released. For all other sawing, the lower guard should operate automatically.
- d) Always observe that the lower guard is covering the blade before placing saw down on bench or floor. An unprotected, coasting blade will cause the saw to walk backwards, cutting whatever is in its path. Be aware of the time it takes for the blade to stop after switch is released.

 - Identify the correct saw blade to be used for the material to be cut
 - Use only saw blades that are marked with a speed equal or higher than the speed marked on the tool

Remove the battery pack before assembly. The tool should not use any abrasive wheels.



Gloves must be weared to avoid injury risk

1) Attaching the saw blade (Fig. F)

- a) Raise the lower guard.
- b) Slip the blade in position.
- c) Insert the outer flange and blade clamp bolt.
- d) Pressing down the spindle lock button and tighten the blade clamp bolt in an anti-clockwise direction with the allen key provided.
- e) Remove the allen key

2) Removing the saw blade (Fig. G)

- a) Press the spindle lock button (9). Turn the blade clamp bolt(4) using the provided allen key in a clockwise direction.
- b) Remove the tensioning flange from the shaft.
- c) Open the lower guard with lower guard lever (2) fully.
- d) Remove the saw blade (5).

3) Adjusting the cutting depth (Fig. H)

- a) Loosen the cutting depth adjustment knob.
- b) Hold the base plate against the edge of the workpiece and lift the saw to the desired cutting depth.
- c) Tighten the cutting depth adjustment knob.

4) Setting the miter angle (Fig. I)

- a) Loosen the miter angle adjustment knob.
- b) Adjust the miter angle of your cut.
- c) Tighten the miter angle adjustment knob.

5 Mounting the guide bar (Fig. I)

- a) Loosen the guide bar knob.
- b) Slide the guide bar through the slots in the base plate to the desired width.
- c) Tighten the guide bar knob.

4. OPERATION

1)Charging the battery pack

IMPORTANT: The battery pack is not fully charged at the factory. Before attempting to charge them, thoroughly read all of the safety instructions.

- 1) To assure that the charger you use are applicable to the battery pack.

1) Cleaning

1. INTENDED USE

This saw intended to be used for cutting wood with the provided blade; that includes plywood, panelling, composition board and hardwood.

Use this blade only for cutting wood. Cutting others material can create accidents and injuries.

Others type of blades can be used in this machine, such as blades for cutting drywall, plastics, metals, etc. You can purchase them in specialized stores. Use only accessories of same trademark and recommended. Ask advice to your retailer.

2. SAFETY WARNINGS





- a) Turn the quick-release blade clamp (6) anticlockwise and insert the saw blade, then release the quick-release blade clamp(6). Make sure that the saw blade issecurely fastened. (Fig. 2)
- b) Turn the quick-release blade clamp (6) anticlockwise to remove the saw blade.(Fig. 3)





NOTE: The blade must be inserted with the teeth tuned downwards, the side with the hole must inserted in the spindle. Failure to install the balde will cause damage, accidents and injuries.

4.4 Soleplate assembly adjustment

- a) Loosen the two cap screws at the bottom of the front handle with the hex key provided.(Fig. 4)
- b) Move the pivot shoe (2) in or out to the position required.
- c) Tighten both cap screws.

4.5 Starting and stopping

- a. The reciprocating saw is equipped with a lock button (3) which reduces the possibility of accidental starting. The lock button (3) is located on the handle above the on/off switch trigger. You must depress the lock button in order to pull the switch trigger. The lock button resets each time the trigger is released.
- b. To turn on the reciprocating saw, depress the lock button (3) and pull the ON/OFF switch trigger (4).
- c. Release the ON/OFF switch trigger to turn off the reciprocating saw.
- d. The speed of the reciprocating saw can be increased by increasing the pressure on the ON/OFF switch trigger.

 Decrease the pressure on the ON/OFF switch trigger will decrease the speed of the reciprocating saw.

4.6 General cutting

Hold the saw firmly in front and clearly away from you. Make sure that the blade is clear of any foreign material. Be sure material to be cut is held firmly. Small workpiece should be securely clamped in vice or with clamps to the workbench or table. Mark the line of cut clearly. Depress the lock off button then pull the ON/OFF switch to start the cutting action. Place the base assembly against the workpiece, then move the blade into it. Do not force. Use only enough pressure to keep the saw cutting. Let the blade do the work. The use of excessive pressure that causes bending or twisting of the blade and may break it.

4.7 Plunge cutting

Mark the line of cut clearly. Choose a convenient starting point inside the area to be cut out and place the tip of the blade over that point. Rest the front edge of shoe assembly on the workpiece and hold firmly in position. Depress the lock off button then pull the ON/OFF trigger to start the cutting.

Make sure that blade does not touch work until motor reaches full speed, since this could cause loss of control resulting in serious injury.

With blade at full cutting speed, slowly tilt saw downward until the blade starts cutting. After blade penetrates the workpiece, tilt saw until blade is perpendicular to the workpiece.

WARNING: Blade longer than 15cm can whip and should not be used for plunge cutting. Failure to heed this warning can result in serious personal injury.

Cutting into electrical wiring can cause the blade, blade clamp and the saw assembly to become electrically live. Do not touch metal part parts when cutting into a wall. Grasp only the insulated surfaces on the tool. make sure the hidden electrical wiring, water pipes, and mechanical hazrds are not in the blade path when cutting into a wall.

4.8 Metal cutting

You may cut metal such as sheet steel, pipe, steel rod, aluminium, brass and copper with this tool by using the appropriate cutting blade (do not use the provided blade but buy a blade for metal cutting matching with this tool). When metal cutting:

- Do not twist or ben the blade
- Do not force the tool and use a slow speed setting
- Use a cutting oil when cutting soft metal and steel. Cutting oil also keeps the blade cool, increases cutting action and prolongs blade life.
- Never use gasoline since normal sparkling of motor could ignite fumes.
- Clamp the workpiece firmly and cut close to the clamping point to eliminate any vibration of the workpiece. When cutting conduit pipe or angle iron, clamp the workpiece in a vice if possible and cut close to the vice. To cut thin sheet material, "sandwich" the matrial between hardboard or plywood and clamp the layers to eliminate vibration and material tearing.

5. MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE

a. Maintenance

- After use and before cleaning and maintenance, remove the blade and the battery form the tool.
- Clean the housing only with a damp cloth. Do not use solvents! Then wipe thoroughly.
- Check the condition of the tool. If the tool is damaged or has malfunction, do not use it and bring it to a qualified service for inspection or reparation.
- To maintain the optimum battery power, we recommend that the battery be discharged and recharged every two months.

b. Storage

Remove the battery from the tool.

Store the tool in a dry place and protected from freezing, the ambient temperature should not exceed 40°c. Put it out of the reach of children.

6. DISPOSAL

1. APPLICATION

This machine is developed for grinding and roughing of metal and stone. With correct accessories the machine can also be used for brushing and sanding. It is not designed for commercial use.



WARNING! For your own safety, read this manual and the general safety instructions carefully before using the appliance. Your power tool should only be given to other users together with these instructions.

2. GENERAL POWER TOOL SAFETY WARNINGS

WARNING Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury. Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

- 1) Work area safety
- a) Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.
- b) Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.
- c) Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Distractions can cause you to lose control.
- 2) Electrical safety
- a) Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- b) Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.
- c) **Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions.** Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.
- d) Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.
- e) When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use. Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.
- f) If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.
- 3) Personal safety
- a) Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.
- b) **Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection.** *Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.*
- c) Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- d) Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on. A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.
- e) **Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.
- f) Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair and clothing away from moving parts.

Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts.

- g) If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used. Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.
- h) Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool safety principles. A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.
- 4) Power tool use and care
- a) **Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application.** The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.
- b) **Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off.** Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- c) Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.
- d) Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool.

Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.

- e) Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- f) **Keep cutting tools sharp and clean.** Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
- g) Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.
- h) **Keep handles and grasping surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease.** Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.
- 5) Battery tool use and care
- a) **Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer**. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may create a risk of fire when used with another battery pack.
- b) **Use power tools only with specifically designated battery packs**. Use of any other battery packs may create a risk of injury and fire.
- c) When battery pack is not in use, keep it away from other metal objects, like paper clips, coins, keys, nails, screws or other small metal objects, that can make a connection from one terminal to another. Shorting the battery terminals together may cause burns or a fire.
- d) Under abusive conditions, liquid may be ejected from the battery; avoid contact. If contact accidentally occurs, flush with water. If liquid contacts eyes, additionally seek medical help. Liquid ejected from the battery may cause irritation or burns.
- e) Do not use a battery pack or tool that is damaged or modified. Damaged or modified batteries may exhibit unpredictable behaviour resulting in fire, explosion or risk of injury.
- f) **Do not expose a battery pack or tool to fire or excessive temperature**. Exposure to fire or temperature above 130 °C may cause explosion.

NOTE The temperature "130 °C" can be replaced by the temperature "265 °F".

- g) Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or tool outside the temperature range specified in the instructions. Charging improperly or at temperatures outside the specified range may damage the battery and increase the risk of fire.
- 6) Service
- a) Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.

b) **Never service damaged battery packs**. Service of battery packs should only be performed by the manufacturer or authorized service providers.

Safety instructions for all operations

Safety Warnings Common for Grinding, Sanding, Wire Brushing, Polishing or Abrasive Cutting-Off Operations:

- a) This power tool is intended to function as a grinder and cut-off tool. Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.
- b) Operations such as sanding, wire brushing and polishing are not recommended to be performed with this power tool. Operations for which the power tool was not designed may create a hazard and cause personal injury.
- c) Do not use accessories which are not specifically designed and recommended by the tool manufacturer. Just because the accessory can be attached to your power tool, it does not assure safe operation.
- d) The rated speed of the accessory must be at least equal to the maximum speed marked on the power tool. Accessories running faster than their rated speed can break and fly apart.
- e) The outside diameter and the thickness of your accessory must be within the capacity rating of your power tool. *Incorrectly sized accessories cannot be adequately guarded or controlled.*
- f) Threaded mounting of accessories must match the grinder spindle thread. For accessories mounted by flanges, the arbour hole of the accessory must fit the locating diameter of the flange. Accessories that do not match the mounting hardware of the power tool will run out of balance, vibrate excessively and may cause loss of control.
- g) Do not use a damaged accessory. Before each use inspect the accessory such as abrasive wheels for chips and cracks, backing pad for cracks, tear or excess wear, wire brush for loose or cracked wires. If power tool or accessory is dropped, inspect for damage or install an undamaged accessory. After inspecting and installing an accessory, position yourself and bystanders away from the plane of the rotating accessory and run the power tool at maximum no-load speed for one minute. Damaged accessories will normally break apart during this test time.
- h) Wear personal protective equipment. Depending on application, use face shield, safety goggles or safety glasses. As appropriate, wear dust mask, hearing protectors, gloves and workshop apron capable of stopping small abrasive or workpiece fragments. The eye protection must be capable of stopping flying debris generated by various operations. The dust mask or respirator must be capable of filtrating particles generated by your operation. Prolonged exposure to high intensity noise may cause hearing loss.
- i) Keep bystanders a safe distance away from work area. Anyone entering the work area must wear personal protective equipment. Fragments of workpiece or of a broken accessory may fly away and cause injury beyond immediate area of operation.
- j) Hold the power tool by insulated gripping surfaces only, when performing an operation where the cutting accessory may contact hidden wiring or its own cord.
- Cutting accessory contacting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.
- k) **Position the cord clear of the spinning accessory.** If you lose control, the cord may be cut or snagged and your hand or arm may be pulled into the spinning accessory.
- I) Never lay the power tool down until the accessory has come to a complete stop. The spinning accessory may grab the surface and pull the power tool out of your control.
- m) **Do not run the power tool while carrying it at your side.** Accidental contact with the spinning accessory could snag your clothing, pulling the accessory into your body.
- n) **Regularly clean the power tool's air vents.** The motor's fan will draw the dust inside the housing and excessive accumulation of powdered metal may cause electrical hazards.
- o) Do not operate the power tool near flammable materials. Sparks could ignite these materials.
- p) **Do not use accessories that require liquid coolants.** Using water or other liquid coolants may result in electrocution or shock.

Further safety instructions for all operations

Kickback and Related Warnings

Kickback is a sudden reaction to a pinched or snagged rotating wheel, backing pad, brush or any other accessory. Pinching or snagging causes rapid stalling of the rotating accessory which in turn causes the uncontrolled power tool to be forced in the direction opposite of the accessory's rotation at the point of the binding.

For example, if an abrasive wheel is snagged or pinched by the workpiece, the edge of the wheel that is entering into the pinch point can dig into the surface of the material causing the wheel to climb out or kick out. The wheel may either jump toward or away from the operator, depending on direction of the wheel's movement at the point of pinching. Abrasive wheels may also break under these conditions.

Kickback is the result of power tool misuse and/or incorrect operating procedures or conditions and can be avoided by taking proper precautions as given below.

- a) Maintain a firm grip on the power tool and position your body and arm to allow you to resist kickback forces. Always use auxiliary handle, if provided, for maximum control over kickback or torque reaction during start-up. The operator can control torque reactions or kickback forces, if proper precautions are taken.
- b) Never place your hand near the rotating accessory. Accessory may kickback over your hand.
- c) Do not position your body in the area where power tool will move if kickback occurs. Kickback will propel the tool in direction opposite to the wheel's movement at the point of snagging.
- d) Use special care when working corners, sharp edges etc. Avoid bouncing and snagging the accessory. Corners, sharp edges or bouncing have a tendency to snag the rotating accessory and cause loss of control or kickback.
- e) **Do not attach a saw chain woodcarving blade or toothed saw blade.** Such blades create frequent kickback and loss of control.

Additional safety instructions for grinding and cutting-off operations Safety Warnings Specific for Grinding and Abrasive Cutting-Off Operations:

- a) Use only wheel types that are recommended for your power tool and the specific guard designed for the selected wheel. Wheels for which the power tool was not designed cannot be adequately guarded and are unsafe.
- b) The grinding surface of centre depressed wheels must be mounted below the plane of the guard lip. An improperly mounted wheel that projects through the plane of the guard lip cannot be adequately protected.
- c) The guard must be securely attached to the power tool and positioned for maximum safety, so the least amount of wheel is exposed towards the operator. The guard helps to protect the operator from broken wheel fragments, accidental contact with wheel and sparks that could ignite clothing.
- d) Wheels must be used only for recommended applications. For example: do not grind with the side of cut-off wheel. Abrasive cut-off wheels are intended for peripheral grinding, side forces applied to these wheels may cause them to shatter.
- e) Always use undamaged wheel flanges that are of correct size and shape for your selected wheel. Proper wheel flanges support the wheel thus reducing the possibility of wheel breakage. Flanges for cut-off wheels may be different from grinding wheel flanges.
- f) **Do not use worn down wheels from larger power tools.** Wheel intended for larger power tool is not suitable for the higher speed of a smaller tool and may burst.

Additional safety instructions for cutting-off operations Additional Safety Warnings Specific for Abrasive Cutting-Off Operations:

- a) Do not "jam" the cut-off wheel or apply excessive pressure. Do not attempt to make an excessive depth of cut. Overstressing the wheel increases the loading and susceptibility to twisting or binding of the wheel in the cut and the possibility of kickback or wheel breakage.
- b) **Do not position your body in line with and behind the rotating wheel.** When the wheel, at the point of operation, is moving away from your body, the possible kickback may propel the spinning wheel and the power tool directly at you.
- c) When wheel is binding or when interrupting a cut for any reason, switch off the power tool and hold the

power tool motionless until the wheel comes to a complete stop. Never attempt to remove the cut-off wheel from the cut while the wheel is in motion otherwise kickback may occur. Investigate and take corrective action to eliminate the cause of wheel binding.

- d) Do not restart the cutting operation in the workpiece. Let the wheel reach full speed and carefully re-enter the cut. The wheel may bind, walk up or kickback if the power tool is restarted in the workpiece.
- e) Support panels or any oversized workpiece to minimize the risk of wheel pinching and kickback. Large workpieces tend to sag under their own weight. Supports must be placed under the workpiece near the line of cut and near the edge of the workpiece on both sides of the wheel.
- f) Use extra caution when making a "pocket cut" into existing walls or other blind areas. The protruding wheel may cut gas or water pipes, electrical wiring or objects that can cause kickback.

SPECIFIC SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR ANGLE GRINDERS

- Check that the maximum speed indicated on the grinding disc corresponds to the maximum speed of the machine.
 The speed of the machine must not exceed the value on the grinding disc.
- Make sure that the dimensions of the grinding disc correspond to the specifications of the machine.
- Make sure that the grinding disc has been mounted and fastened properly. Do not use reducing rings or adapters
 to make the grinding disc fit properly.
- Treat and store grinding discs in conformance with the supplier's instructions.
- Do not use the machine for grinding workpieces with a maximum thickness exceeding the maximum grinding depth of the grinding disc.
- Do not use grinding discs for deburring.
- When grinding discs have to be mounted on the thread of the spindle, make sure that the spindle has sufficient
 thread. Make sure that the spindle is sufficiently protected and does not touch the grinding surface.
- Before use, inspect the grinding disc for any damage. Do not use grinding discs which are cracked, ripped or otherwise damaged.
- Before use, let the machine run idle for 30 seconds.
- Immediately switch off the machine in case of abnormal vibrations or occurrence of another defect. Carefully inspect the machine and grinding disc before switching the machine on again.
- Make sure that sparks do not put people into danger or that they contact highly flammable substances.
- Make sure that the workpiece is sufficiently supported or clamped. Keep your hands away from the surface to be cut.
- Always wear safety goggles and hearing protection. If desired or required also use another kind of protection like for example an apron or helmet.
- Ensure that mounted wheels and points are fitted in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions.
- Ensure that blotters are used when they are provided with the bonded abrasive product and when they are required.
- If a guard is supplied with the tool never use the tool without such a guard.
- For tools intended to be fitted with threaded hole wheel, ensure that the thread in the wheel is long enough to accept the spindle length.
- Ensure that ventilation openings are kept clear when working in dusty conditions.

SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS FOR BATTERIES AND CHARGER

Batteries

- Never attempt to open for any reason.
- Do not store in locations where the temperature may exceed 40°C (104°F).
- The recommended ambient temperature range for the charging system during charging is 4°C to 40°C.
- The recommended ambient temperature range for tool and battery use is -5°C to 40°C.
- Charge only using the charger provided with the tool.

- Store your batteries in a cool dry place (5°C-20°C/41°F-68°F). Never store batteries in discharged state.
- It is better for Li-ion batteries to discharge and reload them regularly (at least 4 times a year). The ideal charge for long-term storage of your Li-ion battery is 40% of capacity.
- When disposing of batteries, follow the instructions given in the section "Protecting the environment".
- Do not cause short circuits. If connection is made between the positive (+) and negative (-) terminal directly or via accidental contact with metallic objects, the battery is short circuited and an intense current will flow causing heat generation which may lead to casing rupture or fire.
- Do not heat. If batteries are heated to above 100°C (212°F), sealing and insulating separators and other polymer components may be damaged resulting in electrolyte leakage and/or internal short circuiting leading to heat generation causing rupture or file. Moreover do not dispose of the batteries in fire, explosion and/or intense burning may result.
- Under extreme conditions, battery leakage may occur. When you notice liquid on the battery, proceed as follows:
 - Carefully wipe the liquid off using a cloth. Avoid skin contact.
 - In case of skin or eye contact, follow the instructions below:
 - Immediately rinse with water. Neutralize with a mild acid such as lemon juice or vinegar.





5. OPERATION

5.1 Charging the battery pack

IMPORTANT: The battery pack is not fully charged at the factory. Before attempting to charge them, thoroughly read all of the safety instructions.

- 1) To assure that the charger you use are applicable to the battery pack.
- 2) Insert the charger into 220-240V~,50-60Hz outlet. Do not use an extension cord.

The green light(2) will light to show the power is connected.

- 3)Slide the battery into the charger. Make sure the contact with the charger is correct.
- 4) When charging the red light (1) will be constantly lit
- 5) When fully charged the green light(2) will be constantly lit.
- 6). Frequently monitor the charger and battery pack while connected.
- 7). For a fully discharged battery or a new battery, allow the battery pack to charge for 1-2 hours. The green lights will stay on (not flash) when the battery is finished charging.
- 8). Unplug the charger and disconnect it from the battery pack when finished.
- 9). Allow the battery pack to cool completely before using it.
- 10). Store the charger and battery pack indoors, out of reach of children.



Note: If the battery does not fit properly, disconnect it and confirm that the battery pack is the correct model for this charger as shown on the specification chart. Do not charge any other battery pack or any battery pack that does not securely fit the charger.



NOTE: If battery is hot after continuous use in the tool, allow it to cool down to room temperature before charging. This will extend the life of your batteries.





NOTE: Remove battery pack from charger stand which use your thumb or fingers, press the battery's release button in and pull the battery pack off at the same time.

Battery capacity indicator

There are battery capacity indicators on the battery pack; you can check the capacity status of the battery if you squeeze the button. Before using the machine, please press switch trigger to check if the battery is full enough for properly working.

Those 3 LED might show the status of the capacity level of the battery: Inserting and removing the battery.



WARNING: Before making any adjustments ensure the drill is switched off with the direction of rotation selector in the center position

- 1. Remove the battery: press the battery release latch in and at the same time pull the battery pack off.
- 2. To insert the battery, push the battery pack onto the contacts of the tool.

5.2 Fitting the auxiliary handle (Fig. 1)

The auxiliary handle (6) can be attached to the angle grinder in 2 different positions: left and right.

5.3 Assembly the protective guard (Fig. 2 - 3)

- 1. Loosen the clip of the protective guard (7) by pulling lock lever of protective guard (1) outward.
- 2. Turn the protective guard so that uncovered part of the disc is as far apart as possible from the hand on main handle (3).
- 3. Fix the protection guard by pushing the lock lever inwards (the protective guard should no longer be able to move).

NOTE: If the protective guard can not be fixed firmly by the lock lever (1), use a hexagon wrench to tighten the hexagon nut.

5.4 Replacing the grinding disc (Fig. 4 – 5)



Beware – a disc which has been used may be very hot!

- Depress and hold down the spindle lock button (2) to secure the spindle.
- Turn the shaft until it locks.
- Remove the outer flange (a) and backing flange (b) by using the two-hole spanner provided.
- Fit the desired disc (8) on the spindle and replace the outer flange and backing flange. Release the spindle lock.



Important! Only ever press the spindle lock when the motor and grinding spindle are at a standstill!

You must keep the spindle lock pressed while you change the wheel!

For grinding wheels up to approx. 3 mm thick, screw on the flange nut with the flat side facing the grinding wheel.

5.5 Switching on / off (Fig. 6)



Before engage the ON/OFF switch but ton, check that the grinding disc is properly fitted and run smoothly, the outer flange is well tightened.


- Connect the battery pack onto the angle grinder body.
- To switch on the angle grinder, push the lock-off button (9) to left or right and squeeze the ON/OFF switch trigger (4)
- When you release the switch trigger, the tool turns off.
- Do not let go of grinder until it has stopped running.



The wheel continues to rotate after the tool is switched off.

OPERATON MODES Grinding

Hold the handle (3) and auxiliary handle (6) firmly and switch on. Avoid blocking the ventilation slots with your hand, as this may cause the grinder to overheat. Let the disc reach full speed. Apply the grinder to the item.




Maximum effect is achieved when the grinder is held at an angle of 15-30° in relation to the item. Move the grinder gently along the item. Give the grinder time to work. It is rarely necessary to press the disc hard against the surface to be worked. Sparks can occur in the motor compartment during use. This is normal and does not mean the grinder is defective. Switch off the grinder after use.

6. CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

1. APPLICATION

The power tool is intended for sawing wood, metal and plastics. Not suitable for professional use.

2. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

WARNING Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury. Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

- 1) Work area safety
- a) Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.



5. OPERATION

Charging the battery pack

IMPORTANT: The battery pack is not fully charged at the factory. Before attempting to charge them, thoroughly read all of the safety instructions.

- 1) To assure that the charger you use are applicable to the battery pack.
- 2) Insert the charger into 220-240V~,50-60Hz outlet. Do not use an extension cord.

The green light(2) will light to show the power is connected.

- 3)Slide the battery into the charger. Make sure the contact with the charger is correct.
- 4) When charging the red light (1) will be constantly lit
- 5) When fully charged the green light(2) will be constantly lit.
- 6). Frequently monitor the charger and battery pack while connected.
- 7). For a fully discharged battery or a new battery, allow the battery pack to charge for 1-2 hours. The green lights will stay on (not flash) when the battery is finished charging.
- 8). Unplug the charger and disconnect it from the battery pack when finished.
- 9). Allow the battery pack to cool completely before using it.
- 10). Store the charger and battery pack indoors, out of reach of children.



Note: If the battery does not fit properly, disconnect it and confirm that the battery pack is the correct model for this charger as shown on the specification chart. Do not charge any other battery pack or any battery pack that does not securely fit the charger.



NOTE: If battery is hot after continuous use in the tool, allow it to cool down to room temperature before charging. This will extend the life of your batteries.

Remove battery pack from charger stand which use your thumb or fingers, press the battery's release button in and pull the battery pack off at the same time.

Battery capacity indicator

There are battery capacity indicators on the battery pack; you can check the capacity status of the battery if you squeeze the button. Before using the machine, please press switch trigger to check if the battery is full enough for properly working.



Those 3 LED might show the status of the capacity level of the battery: Inserting and removing the battery.



WARNING: Before making any adjustments ensure the drill is switched off with the direction of rotation selector in the center position

- 1. Remove the battery: press the battery release latch in and at the same time pull the battery pack off.
- 2. To insert the battery, push the battery pack onto the contacts of the tool.

5.1 Adjusting the soleplate

- The soleplate (8) can be tilt adjusted 45° (left or right) in relation to the saw perpendicular to facilitate contour sawing.
- •Loosen the two clamping screws (B) under the soleplate using the hexagon key (A) supplied with the tool, adjust the soleplate to the desired angle and re- tighten the screws (B).
- •The angle can be set using a marked scale on top of the soleplate.
- This jig saw is equipped with four cutting actions, one straight and three orbital.
- Orbital action has a more aggressive blade motion and is designed for cutting in soft materials like wood or plastic.





• Orbital action provides faster cut, but with a rougher cut across the material. In orbital action, the blade moves forward during the cutting stroke in addition to the up and down motion.

Note: Metal or hardwoods should never be cut in orbital action.

- To adjust the cutting action, moves the pendulum regulation control (9) between the four cutting positions: 0,1,2, and 3.
- Position 0 is the straight cutting.
- Positions 1, 2 and 3 are orbital cutting.
- The aggressiveness of the cut increase as the control is moved from one to three, with three being the most aggressive cut.
- Never use a blade unsuitable for the task and item to be cut.

Hold the saw in front of you with a firm grip on the handle.

- Ensure that the saw blade is not touching anything and that the power cable is not in the way when starting the saw. Make sure that the item is clamped tight, and that the saw line is clearly marked. Connect the vacuum extractor nozzle to an extractor system where possible.
- Start the saw. Place the soleplate on the item, and let the saw blade touch the saw line.
- Saw, but do not place more pressure on the blade than is necessary. Avoid lateral pressure on the blade.

5.2 Sawing wood

• Check that the item does not contain nails or other metal objects. Always wear a mask.

5.3 Sawing metal

• We recommend lubricating the material and saw blade with cutting oil to protect the tool and avoid overheating. Support the item securely with wooden blocks.

Important! Check all screws on the saw regularly, particularly those that hold the blade. Tighten if required.
