1. SAFETY WARNINGS



General power tool safety warnings

WARNING Read all safety warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this power tool. *Failure to follow all instructions listed below may result in electric shock, fire and/or serious injury.*

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term "power tool" in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

1) Work area safety

a) **Keep work area clean and well lit.** *Cluttered or dark areas invite accidents.*

b) **Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust.** *Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or fumes.*

c) **Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool.** *Distractions can cause you to lose control.*

2) Electrical safety

a) **Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools.** *Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.*

b) **Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces, such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators.** *There is an increased risk of electric shock if your body is earthed or grounded.*

c) **Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions.** *Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electric shock.*

d) **Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying, pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts.** *Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock.*

e) **When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use.** *Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock.*

f) **If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply.** *Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock.*

NOTE The term "residual current device (RCD)" can be replaced by the term "ground fault circuit interrupter (GFCI)" or "earth leakage circuit breaker (ELCB)".

3) Personal safety

a) **Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication.** *A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.*

b) **Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection.** *Protective equipment such as a dust mask, non-skid safety shoes, hard hat or hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.*

c) **Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool.**

Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energising power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.

d) **Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on.** *A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury.*

e) **Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times.** *This enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.*

f) **Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair and clothing away from moving parts.** *Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts.*

g) **If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these are connected and properly used.** *Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards.*

h) Do not let familiarity gained from frequent use of tools allow you to become complacent and ignore tool safety principles. A careless action can cause severe injury within a fraction of a second.

4) Power tool use and care

a) Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application. The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.

b) Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off. Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.

c) Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or remove the battery pack, if detachable, from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally.

d) Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool.

Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.

e) Maintain power tools and accessories. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power tool repaired before use. Many accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.

f) Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting edges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.

g) Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different from those intended could result in a hazardous situation.

h) Keep handles and grasping surfaces dry, clean and free from oil and grease. Slippery handles and grasping surfaces do not allow for safe handling and control of the tool in unexpected situations.

5) Service

a) Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.

Additional safety warnings for sander

Hold the power tool by insulated gripping surfaces, because the sanding surface may contact its own cord. Cutting a "live" wire may make exposed metal parts of the power tool "live" and could give the operator an electric shock.

If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by a special cord or assembly available from the manufacturer or its service agent.

a) Ensure that the ventilation slots are not blocked.

b) Always clamp the workpiece with a clamping device. Do not hold the workpiece by hand.

c) Use the type of abrasive sheet suitable for the type of work to be performed.

d) Never use oversized sanding tools.

e) Never use damaged or worn abrasive sheets, or sheets that do not stick firmly to the sanding tray.

f) Never place your hand or fingers near the sanding pad when the sander is running.

g) Keep the power cord away from the work area.

h) Keep handle and sander free of oil, grease, water and other liquids.

i) Never touch the sander before it stops.

j) Do not touch the workpiece or metal chips before cooling.

k) Do not use the sander to work on magnesium parts.







Residual risks

Some dusts produced by sanding, sawing, grinding, drilling and other construction operations contain recognized chemical elements capable of causing cancer, birth defects or other reproductive problems. Some examples of these chemicals:

- Lead from base paints
- Crystalline silica from bricks and cement and other masonry products
- Arsenic and chromium from chemically treated wood.

The risk associated with these exposures varies according to the frequency of this type of work. To reduce your exposure to these chemicals: work in a well-ventilated area and use approved safety equipment such as dust masks specifically designed to filter microscopic particles.

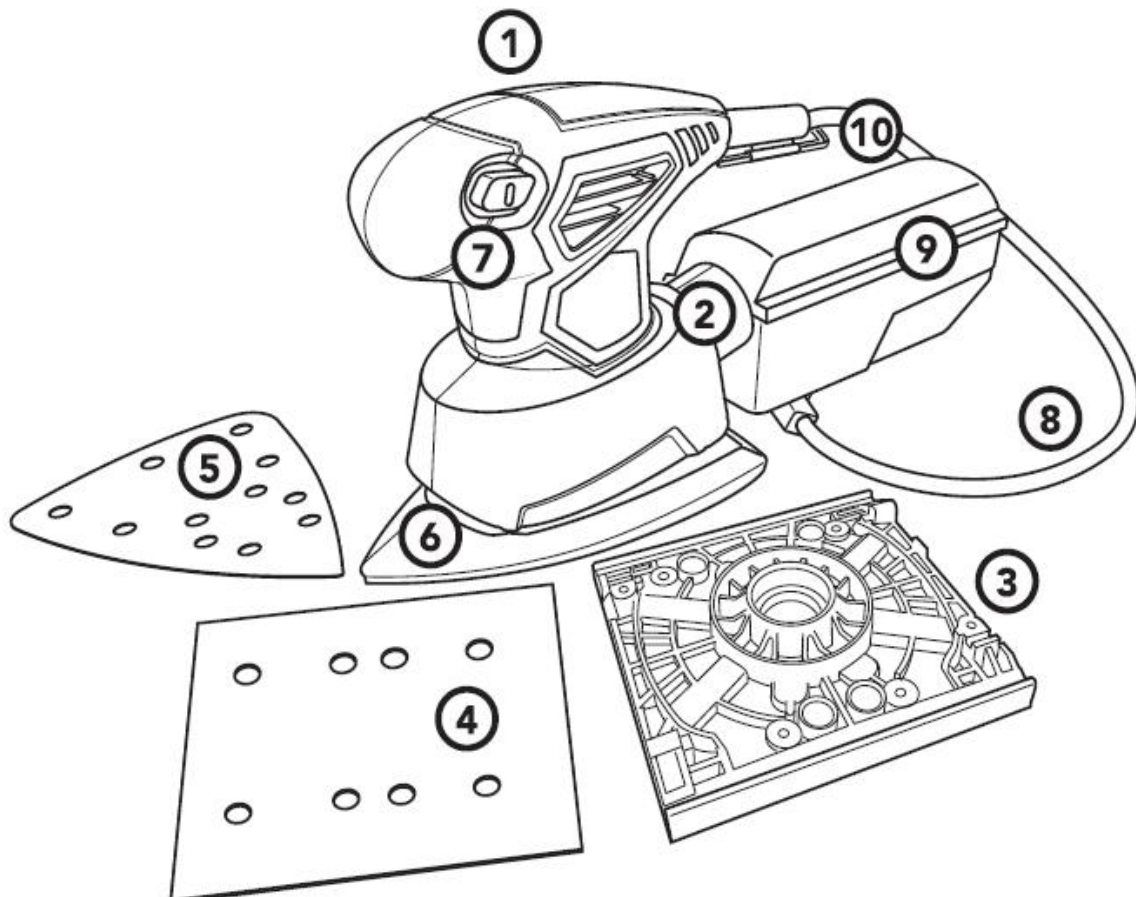

This power tool is designed for dry sanding of wood, plastic, metal and mastic surfaces as well as varnished surfaces.

Vibration and noise emission

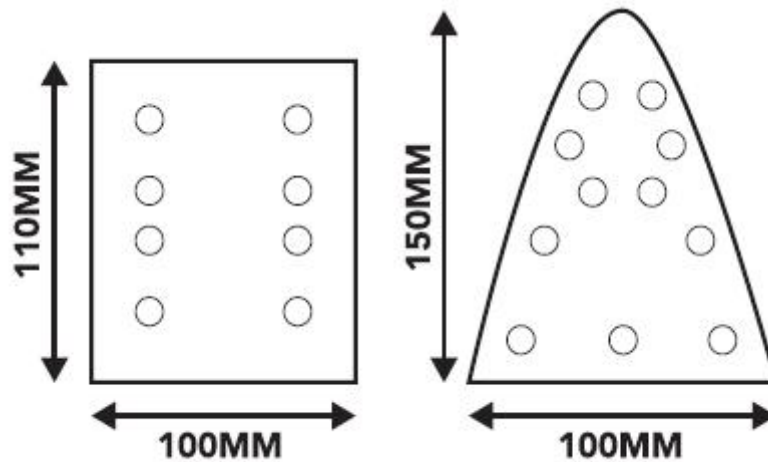

3. USE

Fitting the sandpaper

IMPORTANT: Switch off the tool and unplug the power cord before fitting the sandpaper.

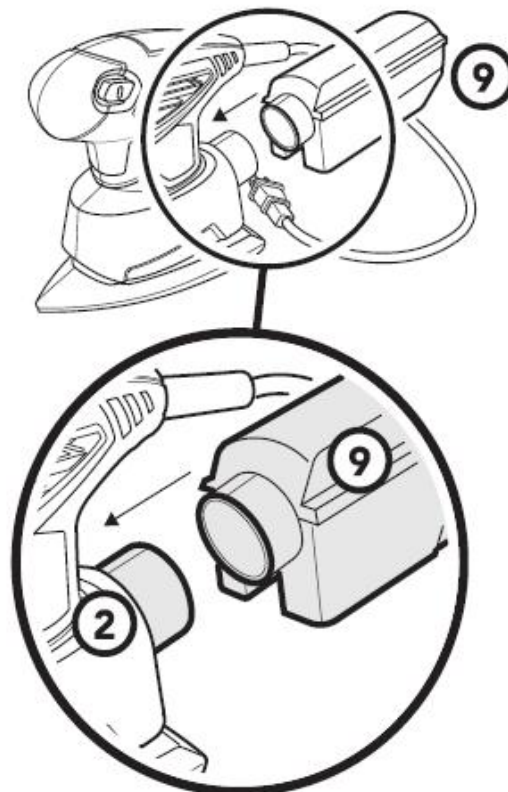
- Using the correct punched Hook and Loop Sanding Sheet, align the holes with those in the HOOK AND LOOP BASE (3,6).
- The sandpaper pad has a Velcro surface for the quick attachment of sandpaper. Brush off any dust from the Velcro surface.
- Smooth the sandpaper onto the pad.
- Align the holes in the sandpaper with the holes in the pad. This will ensure that the dust extraction function operates correctly.



Dust extraction

Slide the DUSTBOX (9) onto the DUST EXTRACTION OUTLET (2).

CAUTION: Always wear a suitable breathing mask when operating this tool. All wood and paint dust is hazardous to health and may also be toxic.



Starting/stopping

WARNING! Never switch on the Sander whilst the HOOK AND LOOP SANDING BASE (3) is in contact with the workpiece or any other surface as this may cause the operator to lose control over the tool and could result in serious injury.

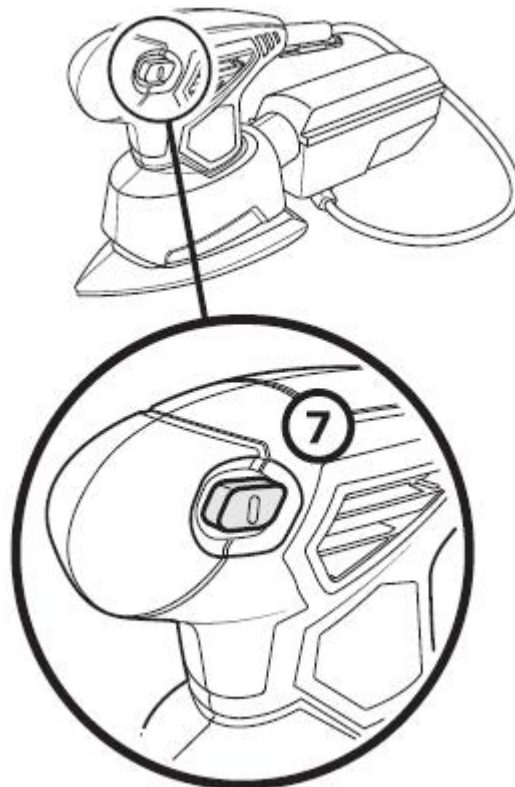
CAUTION: Always hold the Sander securely by the Soft Grip Handle.

Connect the Sander to the mains power supply.

To start the tool, press the ON/ I SLIDE SWITCH(7) to slide it to the right side.

To stop the tool, press the OFF/O SLIDE SWITCH (7) to slide it to the left side.

WARNING! Always wait until the tool has stopped vibrating completely before putting it down. Always disconnect from the power supply after use.



Sanding

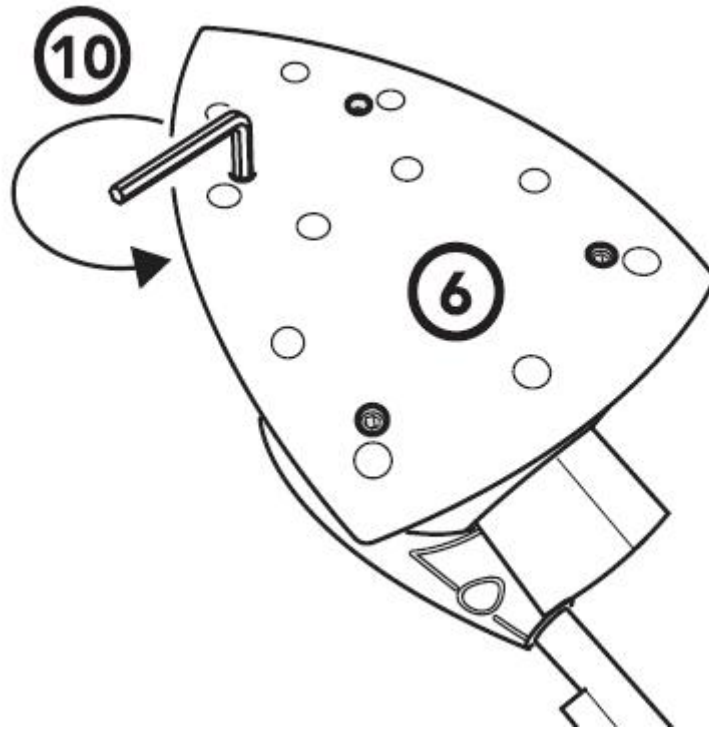
- Place the sanding surface flush with workpiece.
- Start the tool and move it over the workpiece with circular movements. Do not press the tool. The weight of the tool normally produces the right speed and sanding action. Avoid tilting the tool.
- Continue sanding with finer grades of sandpaper.

Polishing

- Apply the polish evenly, allow to dry and then start polishing.
- When you have finished, lift the tool slowly from the workpiece before switching off.

Changing hook & Loop based

- Turn the 2 in 1 Sander upside down.
- Use the HEX KEY (10) provided to unscrew the 4 Hook & Loop Base screws.
- Remove the HOOK & LOOP BASE (3,6).
- To re-attach, place the desired HOOK & LOOP BASE (3,6) onto the 2 in 1 Sander and secure with the Hook & Loop Base screws.



4. MAINTENANCE

- Clean the dust extraction holes regularly with a dry brush.
- Clean the casing with a damp cloth. Do not use solvents. Wipe dry.
- Remove the dust bag and carefully empty it. Avoid inhaling wood dust. Wash the dust bag in cold soapy water and allow to dry.
- Check before use that the tool, power cord, plug and accessories are intact and undamaged. The tool must only be repaired by an authorised service centre or other qualified personnel.
- Products that have reached the end of their useful life must be disposed of in accordance with local regulations.

5. TROUBLESHOOTING

PROBLEM	SOLUTION
THE TOOL WILL NOT START	Ensure the tool is switched on and connected to mains power. Activate the "ON/OFF" Switch. Check the fuse and replace.
THE TOOL KEEPS KICKING/STALLING	Relieve some pressure on the tool, do not exert extra force. Let the tool do the job.
EXCESSIVE VIBRATION	The material is too thick and is placing strain on the motor. If excessive noise continues, discontinue use and seek repairs.
EXCESSIVE NOISE	Too much force is being exerted on the tool. Use less force.
THE TOOL IS OVERHEATING	Allow the tool to cool before using again

THE WARRANTY DOES NOT COVER:

- Start-up and setting up of the product.
- Damage resulting from normal wear and tear of the product.
- Damage resulting from improper use of the product.
- Damage resulting from assembly or start-up not in accordance with the user manual.
- Breakdowns related to carburetion beyond 90 days and fouling of carburetors.
- Periodic and standard maintenance events.
- Actions of modification and dismantling that directly void the warranty.
- Products whose original authentication marking (brand, serial number) has been degraded, altered or withdrawn.
- Replacement of consumables.
- The use of non-original parts.
- Breakage of parts following impacts or projections.
- Accessories breakdowns.
- Defects and their consequences linked to any external cause.
- Loss of components and loss due to insufficient screwing.
- Cutting components and any damage related to the loosening of parts.
- Overload or overheating.
- Poor power supply quality: faulty voltage, voltage error, etc.
- Damages resulting from the deprivation of enjoyment of the product during the time necessary for repairs and more generally the costs related to the immobilization of the product.
- The costs of a second opinion established by a third party following an estimate by a SWAP-Europe repair station
- The use of a product which would show a defect or a breakage which was not the subject of an immediate report and/or repair with the services of SWAP-Europe.
